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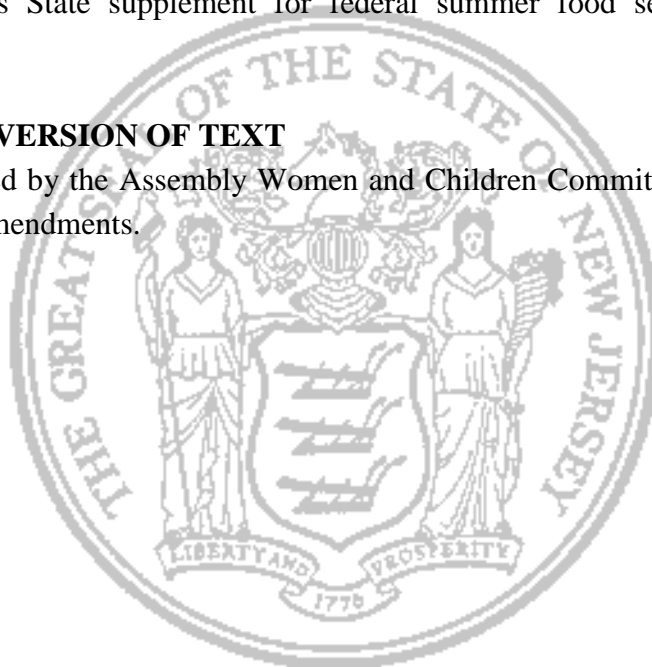

SYNOPSIS

Establishes State supplement for federal summer food service program meals.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Assembly Women and Children Committee on June 16, 2021, with amendments.

1 AN ACT concerning summer food service programs and
2 supplementing Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. a. The Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the
8 Department of Education, shall provide a 10-cent per meal
9 supplement to the existing federal reimbursement to operators of the
10 federal summer food service program.

11 b. The Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the
12 Department of Education, shall provide guidance and support to
13 school districts necessary to effectuate the purposes of this act.

14 c. The Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the
15 Department of Education, shall prepare and issue an annual report
16 to the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164
17 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature on the annual cost of the summer
18 food service program supplement to the State per month, and the
19 number of additional students, since the prior year, participating in
20 the summer food service program.

21 d. The Legislature shall annually appropriate such funds as are
22 necessary to implement this act.

24 2. This act shall take effect June 1, ¹**[2023]** 2022¹.
