AN ACT authorizing the issuance of Operation Desert Storm license plates and supplementing Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

7 1. a. Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the 8 New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue Operation 9 Desert Storm license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased 10 and registered in this State. In addition to the registration number 11 and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, 12 the license plate shall display the words and images that honor the 13 members of the military that served in Operation Desert Storm. The 14 chief administrator, in consultation with the Adjutant General of the 15 New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, shall 16 select the design of the Operation Desert Storm license plates. The 17 Operation Desert Storm license plates shall be subject to the 18 provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as 19 hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.

20 b. Application for issuance of Operation Desert Storm license 21 plates shall be made to the chief administrator on forms and in a 22 manner prescribed by the chief administrator. The application shall 23 include proof satisfactory to the chief administrator that the 24 applicant served in Operation Desert Storm as certified on the 25 applicant's DD-214 form or on a Certificate of Release or Discharge 26 from Active Duty. In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50, payable to the New Jersey 27 28 Motor Vehicle Commission, which shall be in addition to the fee 29 otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles. 30 The chief administrator shall collect annually, subsequent to the 31 year of issuance of the Operation Desert Storm license plate, a \$10 32 fee for the license plate in addition to the fee otherwise prescribed 33 by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The additional fees 34 required by this subsection shall be deposited in the "Operation 35 Desert Storm License Plate Fund" created pursuant to subsection c. 36 of this section.

37 There is created in the Department of the Treasury a special с. 38 non-lapsing fund to be known as the "Operation Desert Storm 39 License Plate Fund." There shall be deposited in the fund the 40 amount collected from all license plate fees collected pursuant to 41 subsection b. of this section, less the amounts necessary to 42 reimburse the commission for administrative costs pursuant to 43 subsection d. of this section. Monies deposited in the fund shall be 44 appropriated annually to the New Jersey Department of Military 45 and Veterans' Affairs and shall be used to support programs 46 benefiting combat veterans. Monies deposited in the fund shall be 47 held in interest-bearing accounts in public depositories as defined

1 pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1970, c.236 (C.17:9-41), and may be 2 invested or reinvested in securities approved by the State Treasurer. 3 Interest or other income earned on monies deposited into the fund, 4 and any monies which may be appropriated or otherwise become 5 available for the purposes of the fund, shall be credited to and deposited in the fund for use as set forth in P.L., c. 6 (C.) 7 (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

8 d. Prior to the deposit of the additional fees collected pursuant 9 to subsection b. of this section into the "Operation Desert Storm 10 License Plate Fund," amounts thereof as are necessary shall be used 11 to reimburse the commission for all costs reasonably and actually 12 incurred, as stipulated by the chief administrator, for:

13 (1) designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the 14 availability of the Operation Desert Storm license plates; and

15 (2) any computer programming changes that may be initially 16 necessary to implement the Operation Desert Storm license plate 17 program established by P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), in an amount not to exceed \$150,000. 18

19 The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State 20 Treasurer the average cost per license plate incurred in the 21 immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, 22 issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the Operation 23 Desert Storm license plates. The annual certification of the average 24 cost per license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget 25 Oversight Committee, or its successor.

26 In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by 27 the chief administrator and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight 28 Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee 29 established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal 30 years, the chief administrator may discontinue the issuance of 31 Operation Desert Storm license plates.

32 The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the e. 33 opportunity to obtain Operation Desert Storm license plates by 34 publicizing the availability of the license plates on the website of 35 the commission. The New Jersey Department of Military and 36 Veterans' Affairs, and any other individual or entity designated by 37 the department, may publicize the availability of the Operation 38 Desert Storm license plates in any manner that the department 39 deems appropriate.

40 f. The chief administrator and adjutant general shall develop 41 and enter into an interdepartmental memorandum of agreement 42 setting forth the procedures to be followed in carrying out their 43 respective responsibilities under P.L., c. (C.) (pending 44 before the Legislature as this bill).

The adjutant general shall appoint a representative who shall 45 g. 46 act as a liaison between the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs and the commission. The liaison shall represent

the department in any and all communications with the commission regarding the Operation Desert Storm license plates established by P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

5 2. a. State or public funds shall not be used by the commission 6 for the initial cost of:

7 (1) designing, producing, issuing, and publicizing the8 availability of Operation Desert Storm license plates; or

9 (2) any computer programming changes which may be 10 necessary to implement the Operation Desert Storm license plate 11 program established by P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 12 Legislature as this bill).

13 b. An individual or entity designated by the New Jersey 14 Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs shall contribute non-15 public monies in an amount to be determined by the chief 16 administrator, not to exceed a total of \$25,000, to be used to offset 17 the initial costs incurred by the commission for designing, 18 producing, issuing, and publicizing the availability of Operation 19 Desert Storm license plates, and any computer programming which 20 may be necessary to implement the program. Concerned 21 organizations and individual donors may contribute monies to the 22 department to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the 23 commission for the Operation Desert Storm license plates 24 authorized by P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the 25 Legislature as this bill). Any amount remaining after the payment 26 of the initial cost shall be deposited in the "Operation Desert Storm 27 License Plate Fund" established pursuant to subsection c. of section 28 1 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this 29 bill).

c. The commission shall not begin designing, producing,
issuing, or publicizing the availability of the Operation Desert
Storm license plates, or making any necessary programming
changes, until the following requirements have been met:

(1) The individual or entity designated by the Department of
Military and Veterans' Affairs has provided the commission with
the non-public monies necessary, as determined by the chief
administrator pursuant to subsection b. of this section, to offset the
initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the
Operation Desert Storm license plate program; and

40 (2) The liaison appointed by the Adjutant General pursuant to 41 subsection g. of section 1 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before 42 the Legislature as this bill) has provided the commission with not 43 less than 500 completed applications for the Operation Desert 44 Storm license plates. These applications shall constitute the initial 45 order for the Operation Desert Storm license plates and shall be 46 accompanied by a fee representing the total cost of the initial order. 47 The fee shall be determined by multiplying the number of sets of

 of license plates as set forth in subsection b. of section 1 of
 P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

5 3. This act shall take effect immediately, but shall remain 6 inoperative until the first day of the 13th month following the date 7 on which the conditions set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) of 8 subsection c. of section 2 of this act have been satisfied. The chief 9 administrator may take anticipatory actions in advance of that date 10 as may be necessary for the timely implementation of this act. This act shall expire if the conditions set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) 11 12 of subsection c. of section 2 of this act are not satisfied by the last 13 day of the 12th month following enactment.

STATEMENT

18 This bill authorizes special Operation Desert Storm license 19 plates. The license plate is to display the words and images that 20 honor members of the military that served in Operation Desert 21 Storm, which was a military operation to defend and expel Iraqi forces that invaded Kuwait. An application to obtain Operation 22 23 Desert Storm license plates is to include satisfactory proof that the 24 applicant served in Operation Desert Storm. In addition to the 25 required motor vehicle registration fees, there is an application fee 26 of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10 for the Operation Desert 27 Storm license plates. After deducting the cost to implement the 28 license plates, the additional fees collected are to be deposited into 29 the "Operation Desert Storm License Fund" and the funds are to be 30 appropriated annually to the New Jersey Department of Military 31 and Veterans' Affairs (department) for programs to benefit combat 32 veterans.

The Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the license plate program.

39 The bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be 40 used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the 41 Operation Desert Storm license plate program. The bill requires that 42 an individual or entity designated by the department contribute nonpublic monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to offset the initial cost to 43 44 design, produce, issue, and publicize the license plates and for any 45 computer programming necessary to implement the program. The 46 bill authorizes the department to receive funds from private sources to be used to offset the initial costs. 47

1 The commission is not required to design, produce, issue, or 2 publicize the availability of the license plates or make any 3 necessary programming changes, until: (1) the individual or entity 4 designated by the department has provided the commission with the 5 money necessary to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the license plate program; and (2) the 6 7 liaison appointed by the department has provided the commission 8 with a minimum of 500 completed applications for the license 9 plates.

10 The provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the first 11 day of the 13th month following the date on which the money to 12 offset the initial costs to establish the license plate program and a 13 minimum of 500 applications are provided to the commission. The 14 bill expires on the last day of the 12th month after enactment if 15 sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not 16 received by that date.
