1 AN ACT making federal funding available to the New Jersey 2 Economic Development Authority to support veteran-owned 3 businesses in need. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 6 of New Jersey:
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8 1. a. Subject to the availability of federal funds provided or 9 made accessible to the State via federal block grant funds allocated 10 to the State from the federal "Coronavirus Relief Fund" established 11 pursuant to the federal "Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic 12 Security Act (CARES Act)," Pub.L.116-136, the "Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund" established pursuant to the federal 13 "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021," Pub.L.117-2, or any other 14 15 federal funds made available to the State in response to the 16 coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, \$2,500,000 from such federal funds shall be made available to the New Jersey 17 Economic Development Authority for the purposes set forth in 18 subsection b. of this section. 19

20 b. The funds made available to the New Jersey Economic Development Authority pursuant to subsection a. of this section 21 shall be reserved by the authority to provide financial support, by 22 23 way of grants, to eligible veteran-owned businesses. The authority 24 may use not more than five percent of the funds to defray any 25 administrative expenses incurred in the implementation of this 26 section.

27 c. The New Jersey Economic Development Authority shall establish the size of the awards and eligibility of entities in 28 29 subsection b. of this section to meet the needs of the veteran-owned 30 businesses in responding to the public health crisis.

d. As used in this section:

32 "Veteran" means any resident of this State now or hereafter who 33 has been discharged honorably or under general honorable 34 conditions who served in any branch of the Armed Forces of the 35 United States or a Reserve component thereof or the National Guard of this State or another state as defined in section 1 of P.L.1963, 36 37 c.109 (C.38A:1-1), and shall include disabled veterans.

"Veteran-owned business" means a business that has its principal 38 39 place of business in the State, is independently owned and operated, 40 and at least 51 percent of which is owned and controlled by persons 41 who are veterans.

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2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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**STATEMENT** 

This bill makes \$2.5 million in federal funds available to the 48 49 Economic Development Authority (EDA) to award grants to

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- 1 eligible veteran-owned businesses. The EDA may use up to five
- 2 percent of these funds to support administrative expenses.
- 3 As defined in the bill, a "veteran-owned business" is a business
- 4 that has its principal place of business in the State, is independently
- 5 owned and operated, and at least 51 percent of which is owned and
- 6 controlled by persons who are veterans.
