SYNOPSIS

Raises statutory threshold for certain public bidding, permits bidder disqualification due to prior negative experience, adds exemptions to public bidding requirement under "State College Contracts Law," and establishes process for cooperative pricing system.

1 AN ACT concerning the awarding of State college and university 2 contracts, amending N.J.S.18A:64-6 and P.L.1992, c.61, and amending and supplementing ¹[P.L.1986, c.43] various parts of 3 the statutory law¹. 4 5 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 1. N.J.S.18A:64-6 is amended to read as follows: 10 18A:64-6. The board of trustees of a State college shall have 11 general supervision over and shall be vested with the conduct of the 12 college. It shall have the power and duty to: 13 a. Adopt and use a corporate seal; 14 b. Determine the educational curriculum and program of the 15 college consistent with the programmatic mission of the institution 16 or approved by the Commission on Higher Education; 17 Determine policies for the organization, administration and c. 18 development of the college; 19 d. Study the educational and financial needs of the college; annually acquaint the Governor and Legislature with the condition 20 21 of the college; and prepare and present the annual budget to the 22 Governor, the Division of Budget and Accounting in the 23 Department of the Treasury and the Legislature in accordance with 24 law: 25 Disburse all moneys appropriated to the college by the e. 26 Legislature and all moneys received from tuition, fees, auxiliary 27 services and other sources; Direct and control expenditures and transfers of funds 28 f. 29 appropriated to the college and tuition received by the college, in 30 accordance with the provisions of the State budget and 31 appropriation acts of the Legislature, reporting changes and 32 additions thereto and transfers thereof to the Director of the 33 Division of Budget and Accounting in the State Department of the 34 Treasury and as to funds received from other sources, direct and 35 control expenditures and transfers in accordance with the terms of any applicable trusts, gifts, bequests, or other special provisions. 36 37 All accounts of the college shall be subject to audit by the State at any time; 38 39 g. In accordance with the provisions of the State budget and 40 appropriation acts of the Legislature, appoint and fix the 41 compensation of a president of the college, who shall be the 42 executive officer of the college and an ex officio member of the board of trustees, without vote, and shall serve at the pleasure of the 43

44 board of trustees;

Professional 19 services also means services rendered in the performance of work 20 that is original and creative in character in a recognized field of 21 artistic endeavor;

h. "Project" means any work, undertaking, construction oralteration;

i. "Purchases" are transactions, for a valuable consideration,
creating or acquiring an interest in goods, services and property
except real property or any interest therein;

j. "State college" means an institution of higher education
established pursuant to chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey
Statutes;

k. "Work" includes services and any other activity of a tangible
or intangible nature performed or assumed pursuant to a contract or
agreement with a State college;

I. "Information technology" means telecommunication and
 <u>computing</u> goods and services, including, but not limited to,
 software, hardware, <u>cloud computing</u>, and systems implementation
 and support for voice, data and video.

The State college has advertised for bids pursuant to section 37 4 of P.L.1986, c.43 (C.18A:64-55) on two occasions and (i) has 38 received no bids on both occasions in response to its advertisement, 39 or (ii) has rejected the bids on two occasions because the State 40 college has determined that they are not reasonable as to price, on 41 the basis of cost estimates prepared for or by the State college prior 42 to the advertising therefor, or have not been independently arrived 43 at in open competition, or (iii) on one occasion no bids were 44 received pursuant to (i) and on one occasion all bids were rejected 45 pursuant to (ii), in whatever sequence; any contract or agreement 46 may then be negotiated by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the 47 authorized membership of the board of trustees authorizing the

48 contract or agreement; provided that:

(1) A reasonable effort is just made by the contracting agent to
 determine that the same or equivalent materials or supplies at a cost
 which is lower than the negotiated price are not available from any
 agency or authority of the United States, the State of New Jersey or
 of the county in which the State college is located, or any
 municipality in close proximity to the State college;

7 (2) The terms, conditions, restrictions and specifications set
8 forth in the negotiated contract or agreement are not substantially
9 different from those which were the subject of competitive bidding
10 pursuant to section 4 of this article; and

11 (3) Any minor amendment or modification of any of the terms, 12 conditions, restrictions and specifications, which were the subject of 13 competitive bidding pursuant to section 4 of P.L.1986, c.43 14 (C.18A:64-55), shall be stated in the resolution awarding the 15 contract or agreement; except that if on the second occasion the 16 bids received are rejected as unreasonable as to price, the State 17 college shall notify each responsible bidder submitting bids on the 18 second occasion of its intention to negotiate and afford each bidder 19 a reasonable opportunity to negotiate, but the State college shall not 20 award the contract or agreement unless the negotiated price is lower 21 than the lowest rejected bid price submitted on the second occasion by a responsible bidder, is the lowest negotiated price offered by 22 23 any reasonable vendor, and is a reasonable price for the work, 24 materials, supplies or services. Whenever a State college shall 25 determine that a bid was not arrived at independently in open 26 competition pursuant to subsection c. (ii) of this section, it shall 27 thereupon notify the Attorney General of the facts upon which its 28 determination is based and, when appropriate, it may institute 29 appropriate proceedings in any State or federal court of competent 30 jurisdiction for a violation of any State or federal antitrust law or 31 laws relating to the unlawful restraint of trade.

Any purchase, contract, or agreement may be made, 38 39 negotiated or awarded by a State college without public advertising 40 for bids and bidding therefor, notwithstanding that the cost or 41 contract price will exceed [\$26,200] ¹[\$100,000 or, commencing 42 1, 2005, the amount determined pursuant January to 43 subsection b. of] the appropriate threshold amount, as adjusted and 44 established pursuant to¹ section 3 of P.L.1986, c.43 (C.18A:64-54), when an emergency affecting the health, safety or welfare of 45 46 occupants of college property requires the immediate delivery of the 47 materials or supplies or the performance of the work, if the

purchases, contracts or agreements are awarded or made in the

The contracting agent, or his 9 deputy in charge, being satisfied that the emergency exists, is 10 authorized to award a contract for the work, materials or supplies.

be paid therefor and the State college is obligated for the payment.

(C.) (pending before the 30 Legislature as this bill).

In the case of a 24 single bid under paragraph (2) or (3), all bids submitted shall set 25 forth the names and license numbers of all subcontractors to whom 26 the general contractor will subcontract the work described in the 27 foregoing categories (a) through (d). Subcontractors who furnish 28 non-specialty trade work pursuant to category (e) in paragraph (1) 29 of this subsection or subcontractors who furnish work to named 30 subcontractors pursuant to categories (a) through (d) in paragraph (1) of this subsection shall not be named in the bid. 31 32 Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this subsection, a State 33 college may choose to require in its bid specification that a 34 subcontractor shall be named in a bid when, in the case of 35 paragraph (1), separate bids for each category, the work of that 36 subcontractor exceeds 35 percent of the State college's estimated 37 amount of value of the work, which shall be set forth in the bid 38 specification. 39 b. Contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder 40 whose bid, conforming to the invitation for bids, will be the most 41 advantageous to the State college , except that a bid may be 42 disqualified due to prior negative experience pursuant to the 43 provisions of section 10 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 44 Legislature as this bill). Whenever two or more bids of equal 45 amounts are the lowest bids submitted by responsible parties, the 46 college may award the contract to any of the parties, as, in its 47 discretion, it may determine.

9. Section 27 of P.L.1986, c.43 (C.18A:64-78) is amended to
 read as follows:
 27. Any college may, by resolution of its board of trustees,

4 authorize the sale in the following manner of its personal property5 not needed for college purposes:

a. If the estimated fair value of the property to be sold exceeds
[\$26,200] <u>\$100,000</u> or, commencing January 1,2005, the amount
determined pursuant to subsection b. of section 3 of P.L.1986, c.43
(C.18A:64-54), in any one sale and the property does not consist of
perishable goods, it shall be sold at public sale to the highest bidder.
b. Notice of the date, time and place of the public sale, together

with a description of the items to be sold and the conditions of sale,
shall be published once in a legal newspaper. Sales shall be held
not less than seven nor more than 14 days after the publication of
the notice thereof.

c. Personal property may be sold to the United States, the State
of New Jersey, another college or to any body politic by private sale
without advertising for bids.

d. If no bids are received, the property may then be sold at
private sale without further publication or notice thereof but in no
event at less than the estimated fair value; or the State college may,
if it so elects, reoffer the property at public sale. As used herein,
"estimated fair value" means the market value of the property if
sold by a willing seller to a willing buyer less the cost to the college
of continuing to store or maintain the property.

26 A State college may reject all bids if it determines a e. 27 rejection to be in the public interest. In any case in which the 28 college has rejected all bids, it may readvertise the personal property for a subsequent public sale. If it elects to reject all bids at 29 30 a second public sale pursuant to this section, it may then sell the 31 personal property without further publication or notice thereof at 32 private sale, but in no event shall the negotiated price at the private 33 sale be less than the amount of the highest bid rejected at the 34 preceding two public sales, nor shall the terms or conditions of sale 35 be changed or amended.

f. If the estimated fair value of the property to be sold does not
exceed [\$26,200] <u>\$100,000</u> or, commencing January 1, 2005, the
amount determined pursuant to subsection b. of section 3 of
P.L.1986, c.43 (C.18A:64-54), in any one sale or the property
consists of perishable goods, it may be sold at private sale without
advertising for bids.

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10. (New section) a. A board of trustees of a State college may,
by resolution approved by a majority of the board and subject to
subsections b. and c. of this section, disqualify a bidder who would
otherwise be determined to be the lowest responsible bidder or the

responsible bidder whose bid would otherwise be determined to be
most advantageous to the State college as applicable, if the board
finds that a board of an institution of higher education in the State
has had prior negative experience with the bidder within the past 15
years.

b. As used in this section, "prior negative experience" meansany of the following:

8 (1) the bidder has been found, through either court adjudication, 9 arbitration, mediation, or other contractually stipulated alternate 10 dispute resolution mechanism, to have: failed to provide or perform 11 goods or services; or failed to complete the contract in a timely 12 manner; or otherwise performed unsatisfactorily under a prior 13 contract with a State college;

(2) the bidder defaulted on a contract, thereby requiring a State
college to utilize the services of another contractor to provide the
goods or perform the services or to correct or complete the contract;

(3) the bidder defaulted on a contract, thereby requiring a State
college to look to the bidder's surety for completion of the contract
or tender of the costs of completion; or

(4) the bidder is debarred or suspended from contracting with
any of the agencies or departments of the executive branch of the
State of New Jersey at the time of the contract award, whether or
not the action was based on experience with a State college.

c. The following conditions shall apply if the State college iscontemplating a disqualification based on prior negative experience:

(1) The existence of any of the indicators of prior negative
experience set forth in this section shall not require that a bidder be
disqualified. In each instance, the decision to disqualify shall be
made within the discretion of the State college and shall be
rendered in the best interests of the State college.

31 (2) All mitigating factors shall be considered in determining the
32 seriousness of the prior negative experience and in deciding
33 whether disqualification is warranted.

34 (3) The bidder shall be furnished by the State college with a 35 written notice (a) stating that a disqualification is being considered; 36 (b) setting forth the reason for the disqualification; and (c) 37 indicating that the bidder shall be accorded an opportunity for a 38 hearing before the State college if the bidder so requests within a 39 stated period of time. At the hearing, the bidder shall show good 40 cause why the bidder should not be disqualified by presenting 41 documents and testimony. If the State college determines that good 42 cause has not been shown by the bidder, it may vote to find the 43 bidder lacking in responsibility and, thus, disqualified.

44 (4) Disqualification shall be for a reasonable, defined period of45 time which shall not exceed five years.

46 (5) A disqualification, other than a disqualification pursuant to
47 which a State college is prohibited by law from entering into a
48 contract with a bidder, may be voided or the period thereof may be

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1 reduced, in the discretion of the State college, upon the submission 2 of a good faith application under oath, supported by documentary 3 evidence, setting forth substantial and appropriate grounds for the 4 granting of relief, such as reversal of a judgment, or actual change 5 of ownership, management or control of the bidder. (6) An opportunity for a hearing need not be offered to a bidder 6 7 whose disqualification is based on its suspension or debarment by 8 an agency or department of the executive branch of the State of 9 New Jersey. The term of such a disqualification shall be concurrent 10 with the term of the suspension or debarment by the State agency or 11 department. 12 13 ¹11. (New section) a. (1) The governing board of a public 14 institution of higher education may by resolution establish a 15 cooperative pricing system with the governing boards of other 16 public institutions of higher education. 17 (2) A lead agency shall procure goods and services through a 18 cooperative pricing system using a master contract. A master 19 contract shall be secured in accordance with all applicable State 20 contracting and procurement laws. 21 (3) A participating contracting unit may use the master contract 22 during the contract period to procure goods or services of the same 23 specification, quality, and price as that contained in the master 24 contract with the lead agency. 25 b. No vendor shall be required to extend bid prices to 26 participating contracting units in a cooperative pricing system 27 unless so specified in the bids. c. As used in this section: 28 29 "Cooperative pricing system" means a purchasing system in 30 which one public institution of higher education acts as the lead 31 agency in establishing a master contract with a vendor for the 32 provision of goods or services and through which other public 33 institutions of higher education may subsequently procure goods or 34 services using the master contract. "Lead agency" means a public institution of higher education 35 that enters into a master contract under a cooperative pricing system 36 37 pursuant to the provisions of this section. 38 "Participating contracting unit" means a public institution of higher education, other than the lead agency, that procures goods or 39 services from a vendor using a master contract.¹ 40 41 ¹[11.] <u>12.</u>¹ This act shall take effect on the 30th day after the 42
