SYNOPSIS

Requires students, staff, and others present at institutions of higher education to receive COVID-19 vaccine.

1 AN ACT concerning student vaccinations and supplementing Title 2 18A of the New Jersey Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. The Commissioner of Health shall require vaccination 8 against coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) as a condition of in-9 person enrollment in, attendance of classes or activities at, 10 employment by, or the provision of services at or through, a public 11 or private institution of higher education in this State. 12 b. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, an institution of 13 higher education shall not enroll or retain on an in-person basis any student, or employ, retain, or utilize the services of any other 14 15 individual on an in-person basis, who has not submitted acceptable 16 evidence of the student's or other individual's vaccination against 17 COVID-19, as provided by regulation of the Commissioner of 18 Health. c. The Commissioner of Health shall require each institution of 19 20 higher education in this State to offer the COVID-19 vaccination to 21 its students, staff, employees, and in-person contracted workers through the institution's student health services program or through 22 23 a contractual agreement with a community health care provider. 24 d. A student or other individual shall not be required to receive 25 a vaccination against COVID-19 under this section if the student or 26 other individual, or the student or other individual's parent or guardian in the case of a student or other individual who is younger 27 than 18 years of age, submits to the institution of higher education: 28 29 (1) a written statement issued by a licensed physician indicating 30 that the COVID-19 vaccine is medically contraindicated for a 31 specific period of time and the reasons for the medical

contraindication, which shall be valid medical reasons as
determined by regulation of the Commissioner of Health. A
statement that meets the requirements of this paragraph shall
exempt the student or other individual from the vaccination
requirements of this section for the stated period of time; or

37 (2) a written statement explaining how the administration of the
38 vaccine conflicts with the bona fide religious tenets or practices of
39 the student or other individual, or the parent or guardian of the
40 student or other individual, as appropriate; except that a general
41 philosophical or moral objection to the vaccination shall not be
42 sufficient for an exemption on religious grounds.

e. No person shall be required to receive a vaccination against
COVID-19 under this section if the person will have no in-person
presence on the premises of an institution of higher education.

47 2. The Commissioner of Health shall adopt rules and 48 regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act,"

4	3. This act shall take effect immediately.

7	STATEMENT
8	
9	This bill requires vaccination against coronavirus disease 2019
10	(COVID-19) as a condition of in-person enrollment in, attendance
11	of classes or activities at, employment by, or the provision of
12	services at or through, a public or private institution of higher
13	education in this State. Commence with the start of the 2021-2022
14	school year, institutions of higher education will be prohibited from
15	enrolling or retaining on an in-person basis any student, or
16	employing, retaining, or utilizing the services of any other
17	individual on an in-person basis, who has not submitted acceptable
18	evidence of vaccination against COVID-19.
19	Each institution of higher education in New Jersey will be
20	required to offer the COVID-19 vaccination to its students, staff,
21	employees, and in-person contracted workers through the
22	institution's student health services program or through a
23	contractual agreement with a community health care provider.
24	A student or other individual may be granted an exemption from
25	the COVID-19 vaccination requirements set forth in the bill if the
26	student or other individual submits:
27	1) a written statement issued by a licensed physician indicating
28	that the COVID-19 vaccine is medically contraindicated for a
29	specific period of time and the reasons for the medical
30	contraindication, which are to be valid medical reasons as
31	established by the Commissioner of Health. The medical
32	exemption will be valid for the period of time indicated in the
33	physician's written statement; or
34	2) a written statement explaining how the administration of the
35	vaccine conflicts with the bona fide religious tenets or practices of
36	the student or other individual, or the student's or individual's
37	parent or guardian, as appropriate; except that a general
38	philosophical or moral objection to the vaccination will not be
39	sufficient for an exemption on religious grounds.
40	No person will be required to receive a vaccination against
41	COVID-19 under the bill if the person will have no in-person
42	presence on the premises of an institution of higher education.
