6	WHEREAS, Traditionally, many banks and other depository institutions
7	provided customers with monthly paper statements for checking
8	and savings accounts, but in recent years many of these banks and
9	other depository institutions have begun charging customers a fee
10	for paper statements; and
11	WHEREAS, While federal law requires National banks to provide
12	periodic statements in certain circumstances, federal law currently
13	permits banks to charge customers a fee for paper statements; and
14	WHEREAS, Some customers have become accustomed to "online
15	banking," but many banking customers that are seniors do not own
16	or customarily operate computers and electronic devices, and
17	therefore are unable to easily obtain electronic statements; and
18	WHEREAS, In response to this problem, Assembly Bill No. 1415,
19	introduced in the General Assembly of the State of New Jersey in
20	the 2018-2019 legislative session, would require, with respect to
21	any account held by an elder adult, State-regulated depository
22	institutions to mail periodic account statements in paper form to the
23	account holder without charge, but due to federal preemption of
24	state laws in this area, in the case of federally-regulated depository
25	institutions, the State cannot prohibit such fees for paper
26	statements; and
27	WHEREAS, Therefore, this resolution calls upon the President and
28	Congress of the United States to enact legislation, similar to
29	Assembly Bill No. 1415, to require federally-regulated depository
30	institutions to provide periodic paper account statements to elder
31	adults without charge; now, therefore,
