A JOINT RESOLUTION designating the month of October of each

5 WHEREAS, Universal access to cyberspace has become a vital resource
6 in our society, allowing the residents of New Jersey to better
7 connect with family and friends, complete business transactions
8 remotely, work more efficiently, achieve educational goals, and
9 connect to digital resources and services; and

WHEREAS, Protecting cyberspace should be of paramount importance,
 as this infrastructure is vulnerable to a wide range of threats
 perpetrated through cyberspace, such as banking and financial
 fraud, intellectual property violations, child pornography, human
 exploitation, and other crimes, all of which have substantial social
 and economic consequences; and

WHEREAS, In 2017, the Office of the Attorney General and the New
Jersey Division of State Police (DSP) announced that 687 cyber
data breaches affecting more than 116,000 New Jersey account
holders were reported to the DSP in calendar year 2016; and

WHEREAS, The New Jersey Cybersecurity and Communications
 Integration Cell brings together analysts and engineers for cyber
 security information sharing, threat analysis, and incident reporting
 to fight against cyber threats on behalf of New Jersey residents and
 businesses; and

WHEREAS, While the government can take steps to maintain a safe
cyber community, the government alone cannot solve the problem,
as cyber security is a shared responsibility; and

WHEREAS, The federal "Stop.Think.Connect." campaign has been
 designated as the national public awareness campaign implemented
 through a coalition of private companies, nonprofits, government
 organizations, and academic institutions working together to
 increase the understanding of cyber threats and empowering the
 American public to be safer and more secure online; and

WHEREAS, The President of the United States, the U.S. Department of
Homeland Security, the Multi-State Information Sharing and
Analysis Center, the National Association of State Chief
Information Officers, and the National Cyber Security Alliance
have declared the month of October as National Cyber Security
Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, The State of New Jersey recognizes that it is in the best
interest of its citizens that people of all ages should know how to
take appropriate measures to protect their online accounts and
personal information and declares October as "Cyber Security
Awareness Month" in this State to educate and inform the residents
of New Jersey about the risks of the internet and the importance of
being safe and responsible online; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 2 State of New Jersey: 3 1. October of each year is designated as "Cyber Security 4 5 Awareness Month" in New Jersey to educate the citizens of the State on the risks of the Internet and the importance of being safe 6 7 and responsible online. 8 9 2. The Governor shall annually issue a proclamation and call 10 upon public officials, private organizations, and all citizens of this State to observe "Cyber Security Awareness Month" with 11 12 appropriate activities and programs. 13 14 3. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately. 15 16 17 **STATEMENT** 18 This joint resolution designates the month of October as "Cyber 19 20 Security Awareness Month" in New Jersey to educate the citizens 21 of the State on the risks of the Internet and the importance of being 22 safe and responsible cyberspace users. The resolution also requires 23 the Governor to issue a proclamation calling on public officials and 24 citizens of New Jersey to observe October as "Cyber Security 25 Awareness Month." 26 Access to cyberspace has become a vital resource in our society, 27 allowing the residents of New Jersey to better connect with family 28 and friends, complete business transactions remotely, work more 29 efficiently, achieve educational goals, and connect to digital 30 resources and services. Although this access to cyberspace provides 31 many benefits, there are also potential risks to our confidential 32 information, personal privacy, and personal safety. This resolution 33 will allow the State to increase awareness, education, and training

34 to create a digital community that is safer in this State.
