Designates June 2 of each year as "Gun Violence Awareness Day."

4	WHEREAS, According to data from the Centers for Disease Control
5	and Prevention (CDC), in <sup>1</sup> [2016] 2017 <sup>1</sup> there were a total of
6	<sup>1</sup> [38,658] <u>39,773</u> <sup>1</sup> firearm related deaths in the United States and
7	of those deaths an estimated <sup>1</sup> [13,000] <u>14,542</u> <sup>1</sup> are attributed to
8	firearm homicides; and
9	<sup>1</sup> [WHEREAS, The CDC data indicates that nationwide an annual
10	average of 67,197 nonfatal firearm injuries occur; and ]¹
11	WHEREAS, According to the CDC, in New Jersey there were
12	<sup>1</sup> [485] <u>478</u> <sup>1</sup> firearm related deaths in <sup>1</sup> [2016] <u>2017</u> <sup>1</sup> and <sup>1</sup> [475]
13	$420^{1}$ firearm related deaths in $^{1}[2015]$ $2018^{1}$ ; and
14	WHEREAS, Americans are 25 times more likely to be murdered with
15	firearms than people in other developed countries; and
16	WHEREAS, Firearm violence is the leading cause of death for
17	women in instances of domestic violence in the United States
18	each year; and
19	WHEREAS, <sup>1</sup> [Thousands of children under the age of 19 annually
20	die as a result of firearms] An estimated 1,500 children die
21	annually as a result of firearms, according to the Giffords Law
22	Center to Prevent Gun Violence <sup>1</sup> ; and
23	WHEREAS, One example of these tragic child victims is Hadiya
24	Pendleton who, at the age of 15, was shot and killed in Chicago
25	just one week after performing at <sup>1</sup> former <sup>1</sup> President <sup>1</sup> Barack <sup>1</sup>
26	Obama's second inaugural parade in 2013; and
27	WHEREAS, On June 2, 2013, a group of Chicago teens
28	commemorated the life of their slain friend, Hadiya, by marching
29	to raise awareness about firearm violence; and
30	WHEREAS, Many communities across the nation have marched
31	annually on June 2 to recognize the death of Hadiya, to honor the
32	many lives cut short and the hundreds more injured by firearm
33	violence every day, and to demand action to end these tragedies;

35	WHEREAS, Support for the Second Amendment rights of law-
36	abiding citizens goes hand-in-hand with keeping firearms away
37	from dangerous people; and
38	WHEREAS, The goals of the national "Gun Violence Awareness
39	Day" campaign are: to promote greater awareness about firearm
40	violence and firearm safety; to concentrate annual heightened

#### AJR33 [1R] LOPEZ, MCKNIGHT

1	WHEREAS, The State of New Jersey encourages all citizens to
2	support their local communities' efforts to prevent the tragic
3	effects of firearm violence and declares June 2 of every year as
4	"Gun Violence Awareness Day" in this State to honor and
5	remember all victims and survivors of firearm violence and to
6	declare that we as a country must do more to reduce firearm
7	violence; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. June 2 of each year is designated as "Gun Violence Awareness Day" in New Jersey to honor and remember all victims of, and others affected by, firearm violence.

2. The Governor shall annually issue a proclamation and call upon public officials, private organizations, and all citizens of this State to observe "Gun Violence Awareness Day" with appropriate awareness activities and programs.

3. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately.
