1 AN ACT establishing a Troops to College Grant Program and 2 amending P.L.2009, c.125. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2009, c.125 (C.18A:3B-42) is amended to 8 read as follows: 2. a. 9 The [New Jersey Commission on] Secretary of Higher 10 Education, in consultation with the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs, shall establish the Troops to College Program. 11 12 The purpose of the program shall be to assist New Jersey's ¹[public]¹ institutions of higher education in coordinating the 13 14 provision of a comprehensive array of services to assist veterans in 15 making the transition into the college classroom. The services may 16 include, but need not be limited to, assistance in applying for State and federal student financial aid, counseling resources, a campus 17 veterans' assistance officer to provide a single point of contact for 18 19 information on the institution's benefits and programs for veterans, 20 and an online resource to consolidate pertinent information 21 specifically for veterans attending that institution. 22 b. The [commission] secretary in implementing the Troops to 23 College Program shall include on its Internet site information to 24 assist veterans in accessing the higher education opportunities that 25 exist in the State. The information shall include, but need not be limited to: 26 27 (1) contact information for the campus veterans' assistance officer at each of the ¹[public]¹ institutions of higher education; 28 29 and 30 (2) information on the array of programs and services available to veterans at each of the ¹[public]¹ institutions of higher 31 32 education. 33 c. The secretary, in consultation with the department, shall establish a Troops to College Grant Program. Under the program, 34 the secretary shall annually select up to three ¹[public]¹ institutions 35 36 of higher education to receive a \$150,000 Troops to College grant. In order to receive a grant, an institution shall demonstrate that it is 37 38 providing a comprehensive array of services, benefits, and programs 39 for veterans attending the institution. In awarding a grant to an institution, the secretary shall consider the following factors: 40

(1) the total number of 1 self-reporting 1 veterans enrolled in the 1 2 institution; 3 (2) the existence of a veterans' affairs office at the institution 4 and the number of staff assigned to the office; 5 (3) whether the institution has entered into the Department of Defense Voluntary Education Partnership Memorandum of 6 7 Understanding; 8 (4) whether the institution's tuition and fees are at or below the 9 minimum limits established by the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational 10 Assistance Act of 2008," Pub.L.110-252 (38 U.S.C. s.3301 et seq.); (5) whether the institution participates in the Yellow Ribbon 11 12 Program of the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 13 2008," Pub.L110-252 (38 U.S.C. s.3301 et seq.); 14 (6) whether the institution waives its application fee and offers 15 priority registration to veterans; 16 (7) the level of academic and staff support provided to veterans 17 enrolled in the institution; 18 (8) the number and type of extracurricular activities designed 19 for and offered to veterans enrolled in the institution; 20 (9) the amount of institutional funds allocated to support 21 veterans enrolled in the institution, including the number of 22 scholarships offered to veteran students; 23 (10) whether the institution offers veteran housing or provides an area on campus where veteran students may meet and discuss 24 25 issues of common interest; (11) the course completion rate of ¹self-reporting¹ veterans 26 27 enrolled in the institution; 28 (12) the institution's retention and graduation rates for ¹selfreporting¹ veterans enrolled in the institution; 29 (13) the student loan default rate for ¹self-reporting¹ veterans 30 enrolled in the institution; and 31 (14) the employment and salary status of ¹self-reporting¹ 32 33 veterans six years following graduation from the institution. 34 (cf: P.L.2009, c.125, s.2) 35 36 2. This act shall take effect in the first full academic year 37 following enactment. 38 39 40 41 42 Establishes annual grant program to recognize institutions of 43 higher education that offer comprehensive array of veteran 44 programs and services.
