5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

In addition to any other State aid provided pursuant to 9 P.L.2007, c.260 (C.18A:7F-43 et al.), a school district may receive 10 military impact aid if, in the prebudget year, the school district 11 received a Basic Support Payment of federal Impact Aid under 12 section 7003 of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education 13 Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. s.7703) and the district provides free public education to federally connected children whose parents are on 14 15 active duty in the uniformed services. The amount of military 16 impact aid provided to a district pursuant to this section shall be 17 calculated as follows:

PPLTL is the per pupil general fund tax levy, which is derived by dividing the prebudget year general fund tax levy by resident enrollment, without the inclusion of federally connected children whose parents are on active duty in the uniformed services and who otherwise are included in the calculation of resident enrollment as defined pursuant to section 3 of P.L.2007, c.260 (C.18A:7F-45);

30 PPIA is the per pupil federal impact aid amount, which is the
31 result of dividing the amount of a school district's Basic Support
32 Payment received in the prebudget year by the number of federally
33 connected children whose parents are on active duty in the
34 uniformed services; and

36 REFCMS is the resident enrollment of federally connected
37 children whose parents are on active duty in the uniformed services;

A school district shall not receive military impact aid pursuant tothis section if the difference between PPTL and PPIA is negative.

Such sums as are necessary to provide additional aid to a
 school district for military impact aid determined pursuant to
 section 1 of this act are appropriated from the Property Tax Relief
 Fund to the Department of Education, subject to the approval of the
 Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting.

STATEMENT

12 This bill establishes an additional category of State school aid 13 known as military impact aid. A school district would be eligible 14 for this category of aid if it received a Basic Support Payment of 15 federal Impact Aid in the prior fiscal year and the district provides 16 free public education to federally connected children whose parents 17 are on active duty in the uniformed services. The Federal Impact 18 Aid Program provides financial assistance to school districts that 19 include within their boundaries parcels of land owned by the federal 20 government or that are exempt from local taxation by the federal 21 government. Part of the Federal Impact Aid Program, which is 22 authorized under Section 7003 of the federal Elementary and 23 Secondary Education Act, provides for Basic Support Payments that 24 help school districts that educate federally connected children, 25 including the children of members of the uniformed services.

26 To determine the amount of aid a district would receive under 27 the bill, a per pupil general fund tax levy amount would be calculated by dividing the prior fiscal year general fund tax levy by 28 29 resident enrollment, without the inclusion of federally connected 30 children whose parents are on active duty in the uniformed services. 31 A per pupil federal impact aid amount would also be calculated by 32 dividing the amount of a school district's Basic Support Payment 33 received in the prior fiscal year by the number of federally 34 connected children whose parents are on active duty in the uniformed services. The difference between these two per pupil 35 amounts would then be multiplied by the number of federally 36 37 connected children whose parents are on active duty in the uniformed services. 38
