Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule or 9 regulation to the contrary, during a state of emergency declared by the 10 Governor pursuant to P.L.1942, c.251 (C.App.A:9-33 et seq.), or a 11 public health emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to 12 P.L.2005, c.222 (C.26:13-1 et seq.), and with the approval of the Attorney General, a professional licensing board regulating a mental 13 14 health profession within the Division of Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and Public Safety or, with regard to mental health 15 16 professions regulated by the division, the director of the division, as 17 applicable, may grant a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification on an expedited basis to a recent graduate in 2 <u>New Jersey</u> 18 or² another state who earned a '[bachelors'] master's¹ degree or 19 higher from a program in ²New Jersey or² another state that is 20 intended to lead to a career in a mental health profession and is not yet 21 22 licensed, registered or certified to practice the mental health profession 23 in any jurisdiction. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule or regulation to the contrary, and to effectuate the purposes of this 24 act, the ²[board or]² director ²[, as applicable,]² may take additional 25 action necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare, 26 27 including but not limited to the following:

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b. An individual issued a temporary license, certificate of
