1 AN ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION condemning abuse against individuals 2 who are Asian American and Pacific Islander and recognizes the 3 impacts made on this State and country by Asian American and 4 Pacific Islander heritage. 5 6 WHEREAS, Asian American and Pacific Islanders are a significant and 7 important community in New Jersey; and 8 WHEREAS, The members of these communities have made significant 9 contributions to the culture and economy of this State; and 10 WHEREAS, Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month is 11 celebrated each May and serves to recognize the contributions and 12 influence of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders to the history, culture, and achievements of the United States; and 13 14 WHEREAS, There are approximately 2 million Asian American owned 15 businesses in the United States that generate over \$700 billion in 16 annual revenue and employ nearly 4.5 million workers; and 17 WHEREAS, Over 2 million Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are working across the United States on the frontlines of the COVID-19 18 pandemic in fields such as health care, law enforcement, first 19 20 responders, transportation, supermarkets, and other service 21 industries; and WHEREAS, Twenty three million Asian Americans and Pacific 22 23 Islanders account for seven-percent of the population of the United 24 States; and 25 WHEREAS, New Jersey has nearly 1 million Asian Americans and 26 Pacific Islanders residing in the State, about 10 percent of the State 27 population; and WHEREAS, The use of derogatory and offensive comments against 28 29 Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders has increased during the 30 COVID-19 pandemic; and WHEREAS, The World Health Organization and United States Centers 31 for Disease Control and Prevention recognize that naming COVID-32 33 19 by its geographic location or linking the virus to a specific 34 ethnicity may lead to violence against certain communities; and 35 WHEREAS, Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been an increase in reports of hate crimes and incidents against 36 37 individuals who are Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders; and WHEREAS, The advocacy group Stop AAPI Hate, which tracks 38 39 incidents of hate against individuals who are Asian American and 40 Pacific Islander, reports that it received more than 2,800 reports of hate incidents directed at members of the community nationwide 41 from March to December 2020; and 42 WHEREAS, In March 2020 alone, violence against these communities 43 44 included: a woman wearing a mask being kicked and punched at a 45 New York City subway station; two children and two adults being 46 stabbed at a grocery store in Texas; a couple assaulted in 47 Philadelphia; and a 16 year old boy attacked by bullies in California; and 48

This House condemns abuse and attacks against individuals
 who are Asian American and Pacific Islander and recognizes the
 significant contributions to this State and country by individuals of
 Asian American and Pacific Islander heritage.

shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the General Assembly to the
Governor of the State of New Jersey, the New Jersey Attorney
General, Stop AAPI Hate, and Jersey Promise.

STATEMENT

This resolution condemns any discrimination against Asian American and Pacific Islander communities and recognizes the significant contributions that these communities make on a daily basis to the state of New Jersey and the country.

Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are one of the fastest 27 growing racial groups in New Jersey and it is imperative to build 28 29 understanding and bring disparate communities in New Jersey 30 together. New Jerseyans of Asian and Pacific Islander descent represent roughly 10 percent of the State's total populations, the 31 third highest proportion in the country. These communities 32 33 contribute nearly half a million eligible voters to the State, own roughly 81,000 firms with combined revenue of roughly \$44 34 35 billion, and buying power of roughly \$57 to \$75 billion. Additionally, in the United States, over 2 million Asian Americans 36 37 and Pacific Islanders are working as essential workers on the 38 frontline of the COVID-19 pandemic in fields such as health care, 39 law enforcement, first responders, transportation, supermarkets, and 40 other service industries.

In the past year, since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, there 41 has been a surge in abuse against Asian American and Pacific 42 43 Islander families and communities. Harassment has ranged from 44 being spat on and verbally abused to incidents of physical assault. 45 In New Jersey, Stop AAPI Hate reported nearly 50 incidents related 46 to the COVID-19 pandemic of Asian American and Pacific Islander 47 discrimination between March 19, 2020 and December 31, 2020. 48 This is caused by the rhetoric that blames Asian people for the

1 spread of COVID-1 and continued inflammatory commentary may lead to more violence against the Asian American and Pacific 2 Islander communities. The reported 50 incidents against individuals 3 and communities marks an increase from the previous year. The 4 United Nations has detailed "an alarming level" of racially 5 motivated violence and other hate incidents against Asian 6 Americans and Pacific Islanders. This cannot continue in the state 7 of New Jersey and the country. 8

9 The State of New Jersey condemns and denounces acts of 10 racism, violence, xenophobia, and intolerance against Asian 11 American and Pacific Islander communities and individuals. The 12 State additionally recognizes and promotes the contributions made 13 by the Asian American and Pacific Islander communities 14 throughout the State and country.
