Establishes annual grant program to recognize public institutions of higher education that offer comprehensive array of veteran programs and services.

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1 AN ACT establishing a Troops to College Grant Program and 2 amending P.L.2009, c.125. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2009, c.125 (C.18A:3B-42) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 2. a. The [New Jersey Commission on] Secretary of Higher 10 Education, in consultation with the Department of Military and 11 Veterans' Affairs, shall establish the Troops to College Program. 12 The purpose of the program shall be to assist New Jersey's public 13 institutions of higher education in coordinating the provision of a 14 comprehensive array of services to assist veterans in making the 15 transition into the college classroom. The services may include, but 16 need not be limited to, assistance in applying for State and federal 17 student financial aid, counseling resources, a campus veterans' 18 assistance officer to provide a single point of contact for 19 information on the institution's benefits and programs for veterans, 20 and an online resource to consolidate pertinent information 21 specifically for veterans attending that institution. 22 b. The [commission] secretary in implementing the Troops to 23 College Program shall include on its Internet site information to 24 assist veterans in accessing the higher education opportunities that 25 exist in the State. The information shall include, but need not be 26 limited to: 27 (1) contact information for the campus veterans' assistance officer at each of the public institutions of higher education; and 28 29 (2) information on the array of programs and services available 30 to veterans at each of the public institutions of higher education. 31 c. The secretary, in consultation with the department, shall 32 establish a Troops to College Grant Program. Under the program, 33 the secretary shall annually select up to three public institutions of 34 higher education to receive a \$150,000 Troops to College grant. In 35 order to receive a grant, an institution shall demonstrate that it is 36 providing a comprehensive array of services, benefits, and programs for veterans attending the institution. In awarding a grant to an 37 institution, the secretary shall consider the following factors: 38 39 (1) the total number of veterans enrolled in the institution; 40 (2) the existence of a veterans' affairs office at the institution 41 and the number of staff assigned to the office; 42 (3) whether the institution has entered into the Department of Defense Voluntary Education Partnership Memorandum of 43 44 Understanding; 45 (4) whether the institution's tuition and fees are at or below the minimum limits established by the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational 46 47 Assistance Act of 2008," Pub.L110-252 (38 U.S.C. s.3301 et seq.);

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30	STATEMENT
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32	This bill establishes an annual grant program under the State's
33	Troops to College Program which was established in 2009 to assist
34	New Jersey's public institutions of higher education in coordinating
35	the provision of a comprehensive array of services to assist veterans
36	in making the transition into the college classroom. This bill will
37	recognize and support those efforts through the establishment of an
38	annual grant program. The program will be developed by the
39	Secretary of Higher Education, in consultation with the Department
40	of Military and Veterans' Affairs. Under the program, the secretary
41	will annually select up to three public institutions of higher
42	education to receive a \$150,000 Troops to College grant. In order
43	to receive a grant, an institution must demonstrate that it is offering
44	a comprehensive array of services, benefits, and programs for
45	veterans attending the institution.
46	The bill outlines a number of factors that the secretary will
47	consider in awarding the grants that include among others: the total
48	number of veterans enrolled in the institution; the existence of a

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veterans' affairs office at the institution and the number of staff 1 assigned to the office; whether the institution participates in the 2 3 Yellow Ribbon Program of the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational 4 Assistance Act of 2008"; the amount of institutional funds allocated 5 to support veterans enrolled in the institution, including the number of scholarships offered to veteran students; whether the institution 6 7 offers veteran housing or provides an area on campus where veteran 8 students may meet and discuss issues of common interest; the 9 institution's retention and graduation rates for veterans enrolled in 10 the institution; and the employment and salary status of veterans six 11 years following graduation from the institution.
