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#### **SYNOPSIS**

Establishes annual grant program to recognize institutions of higher education that offer comprehensive array of veteran programs and services.

1 **AN ACT** establishing a Troops to College Grant Program and amending P.L.2009, c.125.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2009, c.125 (C.18A:3B-42) is amended to 8 read as follows:
- 9 2. a. The [New Jersey Commission on] Secretary of Higher 10 Education, in consultation with the Department of Military and 11 Veterans' Affairs, shall establish the Troops to College Program. The purpose of the program shall be to assist New Jersey's 12 <sup>1</sup>[public]<sup>1</sup> institutions of higher education in coordinating the 13 provision of a comprehensive array of services to assist veterans in 14 15 making the transition into the college classroom. The services may 16 include, but need not be limited to, assistance in applying for State 17 and federal student financial aid, counseling resources, a campus 18 veterans' assistance officer to provide a single point of contact for 19 information on the institution's benefits and programs for veterans, 20 and an online resource to consolidate pertinent information
  - b. The **[**commission**]** <u>secretary</u> in implementing the Troops to College Program shall include on its Internet site information to assist veterans in accessing the higher education opportunities that exist in the State. The information shall include, but need not be limited to:

specifically for veterans attending that institution.

- (1) contact information for the campus veterans' assistance officer at each of the '[public]' institutions of higher education; and
- (2) information on the array of programs and services available to veterans at each of the <sup>1</sup>[public]<sup>1</sup> institutions of higher education.
- 33 c. The secretary, in consultation with the department, shall 34 establish a Troops to College Grant Program. Under the program, the secretary shall annually select up to three <sup>1</sup>[public]<sup>1</sup> institutions 35 of higher education to receive a \$150,000 Troops to College grant. 36 37 In order to receive a grant, an institution shall demonstrate that it is 38 providing a comprehensive array of services, benefits, and programs 39 for veterans attending the institution. In awarding a grant to an 40 institution, the secretary shall consider the following factors:
- 41 (1) the total number of <sup>1</sup>self-reporting <sup>1</sup> veterans enrolled in the 42 institution;
- 43 (2) the existence of a veterans' affairs office at the institution 44 and the number of staff assigned to the office;
  - (3) whether the institution has entered into the Department of

- 1 <u>Defense Voluntary Education Partnership Memorandum of</u> 2 <u>Understanding</u>;
- 3 (4) whether the institution's tuition and fees are at or below the 4 minimum limits established by the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational
- 5 Assistance Act of 2008," Pub.L.110-252 (38 U.S.C. s.3301 et seq.);
- 6 (5) whether the institution participates in the Yellow Ribbon 7 Program of the "Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 8 2008," Pub.L110-252 (38 U.S.C. s.3301 et seq.);
- 9 (6) whether the institution waives its application fee and offers 10 priority registration to veterans;
- 11 (7) the level of academic and staff support provided to veterans 12 enrolled in the institution;
- 13 (8) the number and type of extracurricular activities designed 14 for and offered to veterans enrolled in the institution;
- 15 (9) the amount of institutional funds allocated to support
  16 veterans enrolled in the institution, including the number of
  17 scholarships offered to veteran students;
- 18 (10) whether the institution offers veteran housing or provides 19 an area on campus where veteran students may meet and discuss 20 issues of common interest;
- 21 (11) the course completion rate of <sup>1</sup>self-reporting <sup>1</sup> veterans 22 enrolled in the institution;
- 23 (12) the institution's retention and graduation rates for <sup>1</sup>self-24 reporting <sup>1</sup> veterans enrolled in the institution;
- 25 (13) the student loan default rate for <sup>1</sup>self-reporting <sup>1</sup> veterans 26 enrolled in the institution; and
- 27 (14) the employment and salary status of <sup>1</sup>self-reporting <sup>1</sup>
  28 veterans six years following graduation from the institution.

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31 2. This act shall take effect in the first full academic year 32 following enactment.
