SYNOPSIS

Establishes "Pediatric Cancer Research Fund" and establishes requirements for disbursement of monies deposited in fund; provides for voluntary contributions by taxpayers on gross income tax returns for pediatric cancer research.

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AN ACT concerning ¹[voluntary contributions through gross income 1 tax returns to support **]**¹ pediatric cancer research, supplementing 2 chapter 9 of Title 54A of the New Jersey Statutes and 3 4 supplementing and amending P.L.1983, c.6 (C.52:9U-1 et seq.). 5 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 1. (New section) a. There is established in the Department of 10 the Treasury a special fund to be known as the "New Jersey Pediatric Cancer Research Fund." 11 12 b. Each taxpayer shall have the opportunity to indicate on the 13 taxpayer's New Jersey gross income tax return that a portion of the 14 taxpayer's refund or an enclosed contribution shall be deposited in 15 the special fund. c. Any costs incurred by the Division of Taxation for collection 16 17 or administration attributable to this act may be deducted from 18 receipts collected pursuant to this act, as determined by the Director 19 of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury. The State Treasurer shall deposit net contributions 20 21 collected pursuant to this section to the "New Jersey Pediatric 22 Cancer Research Fund." d. The Legislature shall annually appropriate all funds 23 deposited in the "New Jersey Pediatric Cancer Research Fund" 24 25 established pursuant to this section to the New Jersey State 26 Commission on Cancer Research, established pursuant to section 4 of P.L.1983, c.6 (C.52:9U-4) ¹, for pediatric cancer research 27 projects. 28 ¹<u>e.</u>¹ As used in this ¹[subsection] <u>section</u>,¹ "pediatric cancer 29 research project" means a scientific research project ¹[, which is]¹ 30 approved ¹[by the commission and] pursuant to section 2 of 31 P.L., c. (C. and C.) (pending before the Legislature as 32 this bill),¹ which ¹scientific research project¹ focuses on the causes, 33 prevention, education, screening, treatment $\frac{1}{1}$ or cure of pediatric 34 cancer ¹, or the symptoms or effects experienced by patients 35 following completion of a course of treatment for pediatric cancer,¹ 36 and may include, but ¹[is] <u>shall</u>¹ not limited to, basic, clinical, and 37 38 epidemiologic research. 39 40 2. (New section) The New Jersey State Commission on Cancer Research ¹, in consultation with the advisory group established 41 pursuant to section 3 of P.L., c. (C.),¹ shall solicit, 42 receive, evaluate and approve applications of qualifying research 43 44 institutions for grants from the "New Jersey Pediatric Cancer

As used in this act: 30 [a.] "Approved research project" means a scientific research 31 project, which is approved by the commission and which focuses on 32 the genetic, biochemical, viral, microbiological and environmental 33 causes of cancer, and may include, but is not limited to, behavioral, 34 socio-economic, demographic and psychosocial research or research 35 into methods of clinical treatment; or which focuses on pain 36 management and palliative care for persons diagnosed with cancer. 37 [b.] "Commission" means the New Jersey State Commission on 38 Cancer Research established pursuant to this act. 39 [c.] "Institutional support services" means all services, 40 facilities, equipment, personnel and expenditures associated with 41 the creation and maintenance of approved research projects. 42 "Pediatric cancer research project" means a scientific [d.] research project approved pursuant to this act, which scientific 43 44 research project focuses on the causes, prevention, education, 45 screening, treatment, or cure of pediatric cancer, or the symptoms or 46 effects experienced by patients following completion of a course of

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1 treatment for pediatric cancer, and may include, but shall not 2 limited to, basic, clinical, and epidemiologic research. "Qualifying research institution" means the Coriell Institute for 3 Medical Research in Camden, New Jersey, Rutgers--The State 4 5 University, Rowan University, Princeton University and any other 6 institution approved by the commission, which is conducting an 7 approved research project. For the purposes of sections 2 through 5 8 of P.L., c. (C.), "qualifying research institution" may include academic medical institutions, State or local government 9 agencies, public or private organizations within New Jersey, and 10 any other institution approved by the commission, which is 11 12 conducting a pediatric cancer research project.¹ 13 (cf: P.L.2012, c.45, s.131) 14 ¹5. Section 5 of P.L.1983, c.6 (C.52:9U-5) is amended to read as 15 16 follows: 17 5. The commission shall: Review and authorize approved research projects; 18 a. 19 Apportion all available funds to qualifying research b. 20 institutions to finance approved research projects and necessary 21 institutional support services; 22 c. Ensure that funds appropriated to approved research projects 23 are not diverted to any other use; 24 d. Take steps necessary to encourage the development within 25 the State of research projects on: 26 (1) the causes of cancer; and 27 (2) pain management and palliative care for persons diagnosed 28 with cancer; 29 e. Compile a directory of all cancer research projects being 30 conducted in the State; and 31 Provide the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, f. 32 c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), the Legislature, with a report by January 30 of each year describing the status of the commission's activities and 33 34 the results of its funded research efforts, which report shall include, 35 with respect to the pediatric cancer research fund established pursuant to section 1 of P.L., c.
