SYNOPSIS

Permits county clerk or register of deeds and mortgages to issue identification card to Gold Star Family member.

Section 1 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.8) is amended to 8 9 read as follows: 10 1. Sections 1 through 8 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.8 et seq.) shall be known and may be cited as the "County Identification 11 Cards for Gold Star [Parents] Families Act." 12 13 (cf: P.L.2017, c.289, s.1) 14 15 2. Section 2 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.9) is amended to 16 read as follows: 17 2. As used in this act, P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.8 et seq.), 18 "Gold Star [Parent] Family Member" means, whether of the whole 19 or half blood or by adoption, as applicable, a spouse, domestic 20 partner, partner in a civil union, parent, legal guardian or other legal 21 custodian, [whether of the whole or half blood or by adoption,] or child of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States who 22 23 died while on active duty for the United States. 24 (cf: P.L.2017, c.289, s.2) 25 26 3. Section 3 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.10) is amended to 27 read as follows: 28 3. A county clerk or register of deeds and mortgages, as 29 appropriate, may establish a Gold Star [Parent] Family identification card program for the sole purpose of identifying the 30 31 holder as a Gold Star [Parent] Family Member when such 32 identification is required to receive discounts or other courtesies 33 extended to military families. 34 (cf: P.L.2017, c.289, s.3) 35 4. Section 4 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.11) is amended to 36 37 read as follows: 38 4. When such a program has been authorized, the county clerk 39 or register of deeds and mortgages, as appropriate, shall issue an identification card to any Gold Star [Parent] Family Member who 40 is a resident of the county. The Gold Star [Parent] Family 41 42 identification card shall display the words "Gold Star [Parent] Family Member," bear the true name and branch of the armed 43 44 forces in which the person who lost his or her life while on active 45 duty for the United States served, and other identifying information

Every application for a Gold Star [Parent] 3 Family identification card shall be signed and certified by the 4 applicant and shall be supported by such documentary evidence as 5 the county clerk or register of deeds and mortgages, as appropriate, 6 may require. 7 (cf: P.L.2017, c.289, s.4) 8 9 5. Section 5 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.12) is amended to 10 read as follows: 5. a. Application for issuance of a Gold Star [Parent] <u>Family</u> 11 12 identification card shall be made in a manner prescribed by the 13 county clerk or register of deeds and mortgages, as appropriate. In 14 order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied 15 by proof satisfactory to the county clerk or register of deeds and mortgages, as appropriate, that the applicant is a [parent] family 16 17 member of a member of the armed forces who died while on active 18 duty for the United States. Proof satisfactory may include any or all 19 of the following: 20 (1) a certification of an organization formed for the support of 21 parents or other family members of members of the armed forces 22 who lost their lives while on active duty for the United States [,] 23 that the applicant is [either the], whether of the whole or half 24 blood or by adoption, as applicable, a spouse, domestic partner, 25 partner in a civil union, parent, legal guardian or other legal custodian, [whether of the whole or half blood or by adoption,] or 26 27 child of a member of the armed forces who died while on active 28 duty for the United States; 29 (2) the service member's federal DD Form 1300, Report of 30 Casualty, or its succeeding form, which identifies the member of 31 the armed forces who died while on active duty for the United 32 States; and 33 (3) documentation indicating the applicant's relationship to the 34 service member. 35 The copy of the DD Form 1300 and the application shall be kept 36 confidential and shall not be considered a government record under P.L.1963, c.73 (C.47:1A-1 et seq.), except that they may be released 37 38 to another government agency. 39 The county clerk or register of deeds and mortgages, as b. 40 appropriate, may consult with a representative of the Department of New Jersey of American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., or any other 41 42 organization formed for the support of parents or other family 43 members of members of the armed forces who lost their lives while 44 on active duty for the United States or the Adjutant General of the 45 Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs when establishing the 46 documentation that may constitute satisfactory proof of an 47 applicant's relationship to the service member. In instances where

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1 applicant is unable to produce documentation deemed an 2 acceptable, the Adjutant General shall assist in making a determination of the applicant's eligibility for a Gold Star [Parent] 3 Family [Identification] identification card. 4 5 (cf: P.L.2017, c.289, s.5) 6 7 6. Section 6 of P.L.2017, c.289 (C.40A:9-78.13) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 6. It shall be unlawful for any person: 10 To display or cause or permit to be displayed or have in the a. 11 person's possession any canceled, fictitious, fraudulently altered, or 12 fraudulently obtained Gold Star [Parent] Family identification 13 card; 14 To lend the Gold Star [Parent] Family identification card to b. 15 any other person or knowingly permit the use thereof by another; 16 To display or represent any Gold Star [Parent] Family с. 17 identification card not issued to the person as being the person's 18 card; 19 d. To permit any unlawful use of a Gold Star [Parent] <u>Family</u> 20 identification card issued to the person; 21 e. To photograph, photostat, duplicate, or in any way reproduce 22 any Gold Star [Parent] Family identification card or facsimile 23 thereof in such a manner that it could be mistaken for a valid Gold 24 Star [Parent] Family identification card, or to display or have in the 25 person's possession any such photograph, photostat, duplicate, 26 reproduction, or facsimile; or 27 f. This act shall take effect immediately. 41 42 **STATEMENT** 43 44 45 This bill permits county clerks or registers of deeds and 46 mortgages, as appropriate, to issue an identification card to Gold

47 Star Families.

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1 Under current law, county clerks or registers of deeds and 2 mortgages, as appropriate, may issue an identification card to a 3 Gold Star Parent. The bill expands eligibility for an identification card to include a Gold Star Family Member, which under the bill is, 4 5 whether of the whole or half blood or by adoption, as applicable, a spouse, domestic partner, partner in a civil union, parent, legal 6 7 guardian or other legal custodian, or child of a member of the 8 Armed Forces of the United States or National Guard, who died 9 while on active duty for the United States.

The cards are designed to help the families of members of the
armed forces who lost their lives while on active duty for the United
States receive discounts or other courtesies extended to military
families.

14 Proof of status may include any or all of the following:

15 (1) a certification from an organization formed for the support 16 of parents or other family members of members of the armed forces 17 who lost their lives while on active duty for the United States, that 18 the applicant is, whether of the whole or half blood or by adoption, as applicable, a spouse, domestic partner, partner in a civil union, 19 20 parent, legal guardian or other legal custodian, or child of a member 21 of the armed forces who died while on active duty for the United 22 States:

(2) the service member's federal DD Form 1300, Report of
Casualty, which identifies the member of the armed forces who died
while on active duty for the United States; and

26 (3) documentation indicating the applicant's relationship to the27 service member.

The DD Form 1300 and the application will be kept confidential and will not be considered a government record under the open public records act.
