1 AN ACT concerning certain business matchmaking events and 2 supplementing Title 52 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. As used in P.L. (C.) (pending before the , c. 8 Legislature as this bill): 9 "Authority" means the New Jersey Economic Development 10 Authority established pursuant to section 4 of P.L.1974, c.80 (C.34:1B-4). 11 "Business Action Center" or "center" means the Business Action 12 13 Center established in the New Jersey Department of State pursuant to Reorganization Plan No. 003-2011. 14 15 "Chief Diversity Officer" means the position established in the 16 Division of Purchase and Property in the New Jersey Department of the Treasury pursuant to section 1 of P.L.2017, c.95 (C.52:32-18.1). 17 initiative" 18 "Matchmaker means the "Biannual Business 19 Matchmaker Initiative" established pursuant to section 2 of 20 P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). "Matchmaking event" means a biannual small business 21 22 matchmaking event established pursuant to section 2 of 23) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). P.L. , c. (C. 24 "Nonprofit corporation" means a private, not-for-profit 25 corporation, determined by the federal Internal Revenue Service to 26 be a tax exempt organization pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of the 27 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, 26 U.S.C. s.501(c)(3), whose mission is to stimulate job creation within and attract capital 28 29 investment to New Jersey. 30 "Small business" means a business engaged in the conduct of a 31 trade or business in this State that qualifies as a "small business 32 concern" within the meaning of the federal "Small Business Act," 33 Pub.L.85-536 (15 U.S.C. s.631 et seq.) for the purpose of the small 34 business's eligibility for receiving assistance from the United States 35 Small Business Administration. "Small business" shall include, but not be limited to, a small business established and operating in this 36 37 State that is certified, pursuant to federal law, under the United 38 States Small Business Administration's 8(a) Business Development 39 program or the HUBZone program, or as a small disadvantaged 40 business, or as a business concern by the United States Department 41 of Housing and Urban Development pursuant to section 3 of the 42 Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (12 U.S.C. s.1701u). 43 44 2. a. The Business Action Center, in consultation with the 45 authority and the Chief Diversity Officer, shall establish and 46 maintain a program, to be known as the "Biannual Business Matchmaker Initiative," where the center shall host a biannual 47 48 business matchmaking event with the purpose of connecting small

1 businesses with representatives of federal, State, and local 2 government agencies and their government contractors seeking 3 small businesses that would provide the government contractor with Each matchmaking event shall be 4 subcontracting services. 5 organized or structured with the goal and in a manner that ensures 6 small businesses participating in the matchmaker initiative are 7 informed of the government subcontracting service opportunities 8 available to small businesses at matchmaking events and that 9 government contractors realize the potential of partnering with 10 small businesses for subcontracting services. The center shall 11 establish the terms and conditions by which a small business and 12 government contractor may apply for participation in the 13 matchmaker initiative. Prior to planning or scheduling a 14 matchmaking event, the center shall contact State and federal 15 agencies to request those agencies to send to the center any small 16 business contact information list which shall be used by the center 17 to solicit small businesses for participation in the matchmaker 18 initiative. 19 b. The center is authorized to seek and accept gifts, grants, or

20 donations from private or public sources for the costs of hosting a 21 matchmaking event, except that the center may not accept a gift, 22 grant, or donation that is subject to conditions that are inconsistent 23 with any other law of this State. The center may enter into an 24 agreement with a nonprofit corporation to allow the nonprofit 25 corporation to host a matchmaking event. The center shall 26 coordinate the scheduling and promotion of each matchmaking 27 event in conjunction with the African American Chamber of 28 Commerce of New Jersey, the Statewide Hispanic Chamber of 29 Commerce of New Jersey, the New Jersey Association of Women 30 Business Owners, the New Jersey State Veterans Chamber of 31 Commerce, and the National Federation of Independent Business in 32 New Jersey.

33 The center, in partnership with the Chief Diversity Officer, c. 34 shall report annually to the Governor and, pursuant to section 2 of 35 P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the Legislature on the number of subcontracts awarded to and the types of government contracting 36 37 services provided by participating small businesses as a result of the 38 implementation of the matchmaker initiative and the percentage of 39 the total number of subcontracts awarded to those participating 40 small businesses.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

47 This bill requires the Business Action Center (BAC) established 48 in the New Jersey Department of State, in consultation with the

1 New Jersey Economic Development Authority and the Chief 2 Diversity Officer, to establish and maintain a program, to be known 3 as the "Biannual Business Matchmaker Initiative" (matchmaker 4 initiative), where the BAC is to host a biannual business 5 matchmaking event (matchmaking event) with the purpose of 6 connecting eligible small businesses with representatives of federal, 7 State, and local government agencies and their government 8 contractors seeking small businesses that would provide the 9 government contractor with subcontracting services. Each 10 matchmaking event is to be organized or structured with the goal 11 and in a manner that ensures small businesses participating in the 12 matchmaker initiative are informed of the government 13 subcontracting service opportunities available to small businesses at 14 a matchmaking event and that government contractors realize the potential of partnering with small businesses for subcontracting 15 16 services. Prior to planning or scheduling a matchmaking event, the 17 BAC is to contact State and federal agencies to request those 18 agencies to send to the BAC any small business contact information 19 list which is to be used by the BAC to solicit small businesses for 20 participation in the matchmaker initiative. The BAC is to establish 21 the terms and conditions by which a small business and government 22 contractor may apply for participation in the matchmaker initiative.

23 The bill authorizes the BAC to seek and accept gifts, grants, or 24 donations from private or public sources for the costs of hosting a 25 matchmaking event. The BAC may enter into an agreement with a 26 nonprofit corporation, whose mission is to stimulate job creation 27 within and attract capital investment to New Jersey, to allow the 28 nonprofit corporation to host a matchmaking event. The bill 29 requires the BAC to coordinate the scheduling and promotion of 30 each matchmaking event in conjunction with the African American 31 Chamber of Commerce of New Jersey, the Statewide Hispanic Chamber of Commerce of New Jersey, the New Jersey Association 32 33 of Women Business Owners, the New Jersey State Veterans 34 Chamber of Commerce, and the National Federation of Independent 35 Business in New Jersey.

The bill requires the BAC, in partnership with the Chief Diversity Officer, to report annually to the Governor and the Legislature on the number of subcontracts awarded to and the types of government contracting services provided by participating small businesses as a result of the implementation of the matchmaker initiative and the percentage of the total number of subcontracts awarded to those participating small businesses.
