- 8 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule or 9 regulation to the contrary, during a state of emergency declared by 10 the Governor pursuant to P.L.1942, c.251 (C.App.A:9-33 et seq.), 11 or a public health emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to 12 P.L.2005, c.222 (C.26:13-1 et seq.), and with the approval of the 13 Attorney General, a professional licensing board regulating a 14 mental health profession within the Division of Consumer Affairs in 15 the Department of Law and Public Safety or, with regard to mental 16 health professions regulated by the division, the director of the 17 division, as applicable, may grant a temporary license, certificate of 18 registration or certification on an expedited basis to a recent 19 graduate in another state who earned a master's degree or higher 20 from a program in another state that is intended to lead to a career 21 in a mental health profession and is not yet licensed, registered or 22 certified to practice the mental health profession in any jurisdiction. 23 Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, rule or regulation 24 to the contrary, and to effectuate the purposes of this act, the board 25 or director, as applicable, may take additional action necessary to 26 protect the public health, safety and welfare, including but not 27 limited to the following:
 - (1) Grant a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification pending the results of a criminal history record background check;
 - (2) Temporarily waive any licensing, registration or certification fees; or
 - (3) Temporarily waive any other requirements contained in Title 45 or other applicable law.
 - b. An individual issued a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification pursuant to this act shall be:
 - (1) issued a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification, as applicable, to provide services with an expiration date marked clearly and conspicuously; and
 - (2) supervised by an individual holding a New Jersey-issued license, certificate of registration or certification, in good standing, in the same profession in which the out-of-State individual is to provide services.
 - c. Upon the Governor's lifting of the state of emergency or public health emergency during which a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification was issued to an individual pursuant to this act to practice a mental health profession, or when the temporary license, certificate of registration or certification

expires, whichever is sooner, and if the individual intends to remain in New Jersey and practice the mental health profession for which the individual was issued a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification, the individual may apply for a full license, certificate of registration or certification to the requisite licensing board or director, as applicable.

d. An individual issued a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification pursuant to this act shall be allowed to apply the experience gained in providing services during the state of emergency or public health emergency to a requirement for experience when applying for full professional licensure, registration or certification to the requisite professional board or, for certain mental health professions regulated by the Division of Consumer Affairs, the director.

e. As used in this act:

"Mental health profession" means a profession licensed by the Alcohol and Drug Counselor Committee; the State Board of Creative Arts and Activities Therapies; the State Board of Marriage and Family Therapy Examiners; the State Board of Medical Examiners; the Professional Counselor Examiners Committee; the Certified Psychoanalysts Advisory Committee; the State Board of Psychological Examiners; the State Board of Social Work Examiners; the New Jersey Board of Nursing and any other entity created hereafter under Title 45 to license or otherwise regulate a mental health profession.

This bill allows, with the approval of the Attorney General, a professional licensing board regulating a mental health profession or, in the case of certain mental health professions, the director of the Division of Consumer Affairs to expedite the issuance of a temporary license, certificate of registration or certification to practice a mental health profession to a recent graduate in another state who earned a master's degree or higher from a program in another state that is intended to lead to a career in a mental health profession and is not yet licensed, registered or certified to practice the mental health profession in any jurisdiction. The individual is granted a temporary credential pending the results of a criminal history background record check. The temporary license, certificate of registration or certification is to include an expiration date posted clearly and conspicuously. Additionally, the individual with the temporary credential is to be supervised by someone licensed in New Jersey in the same profession that the out-of-State individual is temporarily practicing.

1 Once the Governor has lifted the state of emergency or public health emergency under which a temporary license, certificate of 2 3 registration or certification was issued to an individual to practice a 4 mental health profession, or when the temporary license, certificate 5 of registration or certification expires, whichever is sooner, and the individual intends to remain in New Jersey and practice the mental 6 7 health profession for which the individual was a issued a temporary 8 license, certificate of registration or certification, the individual is 9 to apply for a full license, certificate of registration or certification 10 to the requisite professional board or, for certain mental health professions regulated by the Division of Consumer Affairs, the 11 director. If an individual applies for a full license, certificate of 12 13 registration or certification and there is a requirement on the 14 application to demonstrate experience, the individual may use the 15 experience gained in providing services during the state of 16 emergency or public health emergency on the application.
