SYNOPSIS

Allows county boards of elections to determine location of ballot drop boxes by majority vote of its members.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Senate State Government, Wagering, Tourism & Historic Preservation Committee on February 11, 2021, with amendments.



AN ACT concerning the location of ballot drop boxes in each county
 and amending P.L.2020, c.72.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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7 1. Section 1 of P.L.2020, c.72 (C.19:63-16.1) is amended to read8 as follows:

9 1. a. In addition to delivering a voted mail-in ballot by mail or in 10 person as provided under "The Vote By Mail Law," P.L.2009, c.79 11 (C.19:63-1 et seq.), a mail-in voter shall be entitled to deposit the 12 voter's completed mail-in ballot in a ballot drop box established by the county board of elections as provided under this section. Each mail-in 13 14 ballot deposited in a ballot drop box by the time designated under 15 current law for the closing of the polls for that election shall be 16 considered valid and shall be canvassed. If, at the closing of the polls, 17 a voter deposits a mail-in ballot at a ballot drop box in a county in 18 which the voter does not reside, the county board of elections, upon 19 discovering that fact, shall notify and timely deliver the ballot to the 20 county board of elections of the county in which the voter resides, who 21 shall accept the ballot for processing. The limitations and prohibitions 22 applicable to mail-in ballot bearers under "The Vote By Mail Law," 23 P.L.2009, c.79 (C.19:63-1 et seq.) shall apply under this section.

b. (1) For any election, the county board of elections in each county shall establish ballot drop boxes where voters may deposit their voted mail-in ballots at least 45 days before the election. The ballot drop boxes shall be located throughout the county in a manner specified under paragraph (2) of this subsection.

(2) (a) A ballot drop box shall mean a secured drop box that is
not required to be within view of a live person for monitoring. All
ballot drop boxes shall be available for use by a voter 24 hours a day
and shall be placed at locations equipped with security cameras that
allow for surveillance of the ballot drop box.

34 (b) [At least one ballot drop box shall be located at each of the 35 following locations: any county government building in which the main office of the county clerk is located; any municipal government 36 37 building in which the main office of the municipal clerk is located in 38 municipalities with populations larger than 5,000 residents; the main 39 campus of each county community college; the main campus of each 40 State college or university; and the main campus of each independent 41 four-year college or university with enrollments larger than 5,000 42 students.] The board of elections in each county shall determine the 43 locations of the ballot drop boxes in compliance with the requirements of this section. The ballot drop box locations shall be approved by a 44 45 majority vote of the members of the board of elections. However, in

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the event of a tie in the votes cast by the members of the board of elections, the county clerk shall cast the deciding vote. ¹Whenever possible, at least one ballot drop box shall be located in a municipality with an average per capita income or a median family income at or below 250% of the federal poverty guideline according to the most recent federal American Community Survey.¹

7 (c) The board of elections [of any] in each county [that has fewer 8 than 10 ballot drop boxes upon establishing the drop boxes at each 9 location required under subparagraph (b) of this paragraph shall 10 establish additional locations for ballot drop boxes, pursuant to the 11 provisions of subsection c. of this section, so that the county has] shall 12 establish no fewer than 10 ballot drop boxes. The additional drop 13 boxes shall be placed at county or municipal government buildings.] 14 To the best of their ability, the board of elections of every county shall 15 place secure ballot drop boxes based on geographic location and 16 population density to best serve the voters of each county [pursuant to] in compliance with the regulations adopted pursuant to subsection 17 18 c. of this section. The Secretary of State shall establish guidelines for 19 the placement of the ballot drop boxes, the security of the ballot drop 20 boxes, and the schedule for ballot pickup from the ballot boxes.

(d) All ballot drop box locations shall be on sites that meet the
accessibility requirements applicable to polling places under R.S.19:8and shall be subject to the same compliance oversight applicable to
polling places under section 3 of P.L.1991, c.429 (C.19:8-3.3). A
ballot drop box site shall be considered accessible if it is in compliance
with the federal "Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990" (42 U.S.C.
s. 12101 et seq.).

¹(e) No ballot drop box shall be located inside, or within 100 feet
 of an entrance or exit, of a law enforcement agency.¹

30 c. The Secretary of State, in consultation with county boards of 31 elections, shall establish the rules and regulations necessary to ensure 32 the secure and successful implementation of the mail-in ballot drop boxes required by this section ¹to ensure adequate access in various 33 34 <u>geographic areas of the county</u>¹. In determining the ballot drop box 35 locations, the secretary and county boards of elections shall consider, 36 at a minimum, concentrations of population, geographic areas, voter 37 convenience, proximity to public transportation, community-based locations, ¹travel time to the location, proximity to other voting 38 39 locations and ballot drop boxes, commuter traffic patterns,¹ and 40 security. The rules and regulations shall include, but may not be 41 limited to, criteria for each county board of elections to:

42 (1) determine the number of ballot drop boxes required per voter
43 population, considering both the number of registered voters and the
44 number of registered mail-in voters in each county before each
45 election;

(2) select the geographic location of each ballot drop box, ensuring
 an equitable distribution of ballot drop boxes across the county to
 maximize convenience to voters;

4 (3) ensure the accessibility of ballot drop boxes and drop box5 locations to persons with disabilities; and

6 (4) maintain the security of ballot drop boxes and of the ballots 7 deposited therein, including standards and procedures for ballot 8 retrieval by authorized persons only, and for ensuring the proper chain 9 of custody and safe storage of voted mail-in ballots before each 10 election.
