#### **SYNOPSIS**

Establishes Amistad Commission Exemplary Award Program; appropriates \$10,000.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

- AN ACT establishing the Amistad <sup>1</sup>[Curriculum] Commission
  Exemplary <sup>1</sup> Award Program, supplementing <sup>1</sup>[chapter 35 of] <sup>1</sup>
  Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, and making an

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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 9 The <sup>1</sup>[Commissioner Education ] 1. a. of Amistad Commission<sup>1</sup> shall establish the "Amistad <sup>1</sup>[Curriculum] 10 Commission Exemplary Award Program." The purpose of the 11 program is to identify outstanding educators, <sup>1</sup>and the school 12 district in which the educator is employed, <sup>1</sup> for special recognition 13 who have shown a commitment to furthering student knowledge on 14 15 the African slave trade, slavery in America, the vestiges of slavery 16 in this country, and the contributions of African-Americans to our 17 society.
  - b. The '[commissioner] commission' shall invite school districts, charter schools, and renaissance school projects to submit nominations, on an application to be developed by the '[commissioner] commission', by February 1 of each year of an exemplary teacher who deserves recognition for efforts to:
  - (1) ensure that all New Jersey students acquire a broad and deep knowledge of all people who contributed to the founding and development of New Jersey and the United States;
  - (2) promote the self-esteem, confidence, and identity of students who previously may not have learned about past and living examples of people of their own cultural identity who have had positive impacts upon the American story; and
  - (3) provide exemplary lessons, units of study, or courses of study that demonstrate effective instruction of students in alignment with the Amistad curriculum and which lessons, units, or courses of study may be replicated by other educators.
  - c. Recipients of the Amistad <sup>1</sup>[Curriculum] <u>Commission</u>

    <u>Exemplary</u> Award shall be named annually by the Amistad

    <sup>1</sup>[Curriculum] <u>Commission Exemplary</u> Award Committee. The committee shall be an ad hoc committee, the members of which <sup>1</sup>, except for the executive director of the Amistad Commission, <sup>1</sup> shall
- 39 be appointed annually. The committee shall be comprised of the40 following members:
- 41 (1) one member appointed by the Governor;
- 42 (2) one member of the Senate appointed by the President of the 43 Senate;

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- 1 (3) one member of the General Assembly appointed by the 2 Speaker of the General Assembly;
- 3 (4) one member appointed by the New Jersey Education 4 Association; <sup>1</sup>[and]<sup>1</sup>
- 5 (5) one member appointed by the New Jersey Principals and 6 Supervisors Association <sup>1</sup>; and
- 7 (6) the executive director of the Amistad Commission, or a
  8 designee, who shall serve as the chair of the Amistad Commission
  9 Exemplary Award Committee<sup>1</sup>.
- d. The award committee shall annually select two teachers to receive the Amistad <sup>1</sup>[Curriculum] Commission Exemplary <sup>1</sup>

  Award: one teacher from a school that provides instruction in any of the grades kindergarten through eight; and one teacher from a school that provides instruction in any of the grades nine through 12. Recipients of this award shall each receive \$2,500 in recognition of their extraordinary contributions.

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<sup>1</sup>e. Each school district in which the award recipient selected pursuant to the provisions of subsection d. of this section is employed shall also receive the Amistad Commission Exemplary Award. Each school district that receives an award under the provisions of this subsection shall receive \$2,500, which shall be used to assist other teachers in the school district implement the curriculum and teaching techniques of the teacher award recipient. <sup>1</sup>

2. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of <sup>1</sup>[\$5,000] \$10,000<sup>1</sup> to the <sup>1</sup>[Department of Education] Amistad Commission <sup>1</sup> to implement the provisions of this act.

29 3. This act shall take effect in the first full school year 30 following the date of enactment.
