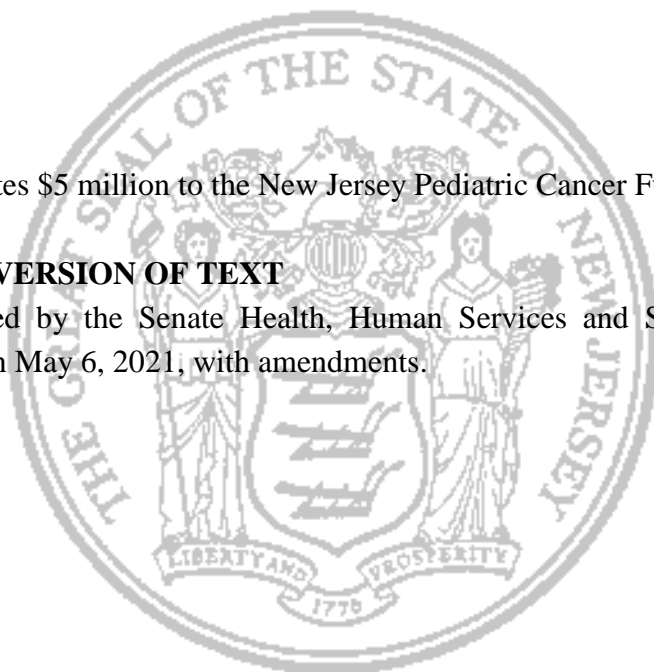

1 AN ACT appropriating \$5,000,000 to the New Jersey Pediatric
2 Cancer Fund.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. a. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the New
8 Jersey Pediatric Cancer Research Fund established pursuant to
9 section 1 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature
10 as Senate Bill No. 1431 or Assembly Bill No. 3800 of 2020/2021)
11 the sum of \$5,000,000 for pediatric cancer research projects ¹**that**
12 are approved by the Pediatric Cancer Research Fund Board pursuant
13 to section 2 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature
14 as Senate Bill No. 1431 or Assembly Bill No. 3800 of
15 2020/2021)**】**¹.

16 b. As used in this section, “pediatric cancer research project”
17 means the same as that term is defined in section 1 of P.L. ,
18 c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as Senate Bill No.
19 1431 or Assembly Bill No. 3800 of 2020/2021).

21 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
