## S3784 GOPAL, MADDEN

1 AN ACT concerning in-State tuition rates for certain students 2 attending public institutions of higher education and amending 3 P.L.1985, c.231. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. Section 1 of P.L.1985, c.231 (C.18A:62-4.1) is amended to 9 read as follows: 10 United States military personnel and their spouses and 11 dependents who are living in New Jersey and are attending public 12 institutions of higher education in New Jersey shall be regarded as 13 residents of the State for the purpose of determining tuition. 14 In the event that a United States military service member is 15 relocated out of the State due to the service member's continued military service, the service member's spouse or dependent shall 16 17 continue to be regarded as residents of the State for the purpose of 18 determining tuition provided that: (1) the spouse or dependent was enrolled in a public institution of higher education in New Jersey 19 20 prior to the service member's relocation; and (2) the spouse or 21 dependent maintains continuous enrollment at the public institution 22 of higher education. This act shall take effect immediately. 26 27 **STATEMENT** 28 29 30 Under current law, United States military personnel and their 31 dependents who are living in New Jersey and are attending public 32 institutions of higher education in New Jersey are regarded as 33 residents of the State for the purpose of determining tuition. This 34 bill amends that law to provide that: 35 the in-State tuition classification also applies to the military 36 service member's spouse; and 37 • in the event that the military service member is relocated out 38 of the State due to the service member's continued military 39 service, the service member's spouse or dependent will not 40 lose their in-State tuition classification provided that: (1) the 41 spouse or dependent was enrolled in a public institution of 42 higher education in New Jersey prior to the service 43 member's relocation; and (2) the spouse or dependent 44 maintains continuous enrollment at the public institution of 45 higher education.
