## SYNOPSIS

Permits cosmetology and hairstyling students with at least 60 hours of course instruction in cosmetology and hairstyling to receive student permit to wash hair.

## **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

1 AN ACT concerning cosmetology and hairstyling student permits 2 and amending P.L.1984, c.205. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 25 of P.L.1984, c.205 (C.45:5B-25) is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 25. a. To be eligible to obtain a student permit, an applicant 10 shall submit to the board satisfactory evidence that [he] the 11 applicant: 12 [a. Is] (1) is a senior student, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:28-6.21, 13 in a course of instruction in cosmetology and hairstyling, beauty 14 culture, barbering, manicuring, hair braiding or skin care, as 15 appropriate; and 16 [b. Does] (2) does not have a communicable, contagious or 17 infectious disease which could reasonably be expected to be 18 transmitted during the course of rendering cosmetology and 19 hairstyling, beauty culture, barbering, manicuring, hair braiding or 20 skin care specialty services. 21 b. A junior student, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:28-6.21, in a course of instruction in cosmetology and hairstyling shall be 22 23 eligible to obtain a student permit for the purpose of shampooing 24 and rinsing hair if the student submits to the board satisfactory 25 evidence that the student: 26 (1) completed at least 60 hours of relevant course instruction; 27 and 28 (2) does not have a communicable, contagious or infectious 29 disease which could reasonably be expected to be transmitted 30 during the course of rendering shampoo and hair rinsing services. 31 c. All permits shall remain valid only during the period that the 32 student is registered at a licensed school of cosmetology and 33 hairstyling or enrolled in an approved vocational program and shall 34 expire upon a student's graduation, withdrawal or leave of absence 35 from the school or program for more than 90 consecutive days. (cf: P.L.2018, c.126, s.16) 36 37 38 2. This act shall take effect 90 days next following enactment. 39 40 41 STATEMENT 42 43 This bill permits a cosmetology and hairstyling student with at 44 least 60 hours of course instruction in cosmetology and hairstyling 45 to receive a student permit to shampoo hair.

**EXPLANATION** – Matter enclosed in **bold-faced** brackets **[thus]** in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined <u>thus</u> is new matter.

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Presently, in order to obtain a student permit to practice cosmetology and hairstyling, beauty culture, barbering, manicuring or skin care, as appropriate based on the course of instruction in which the student is enrolled, an applicant is required to be a senior student with at least 600 hours of course instruction.

6 Under this bill, a junior student in a course of instruction in 7 cosmetology and hairstyling would be eligible to obtain a student 8 permit to shampoo and rinse hair if the student submits to the Board 9 of Cosmetology and Hairstyling satisfactory evidence that the student has completed at least 60 hours of relevant course 10 instruction, and does not have a communicable, contagious or 11 12 infectious disease which could reasonably be expected to be 13 transmitted during the course of rendering shampoo and hair rinsing 14 services.
