SYNOPSIS

Requires instruction on cybersecurity in grades nine through 12; requires Office of Secretary of Higher Education to develop cybersecurity model curricula; establishes loan redemption programs for individuals in certain cybersecurity occupations.

 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

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8 1. As used in sections 2 and 3 of P.L. , c. (C.) 9 (pending before the Legislature as this bill), "cybersecurity" means 10 the practice of defending computers, servers, mobile devices, 11 electronic systems, networks, and data from criminal or 12 unauthorized use or attacks.

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incorporate 14 school district shall 2. Α instruction on 15 cybersecurity in an appropriate place in the curriculum of students 16 in each of the grades nine through 12 as part of the district's 17 implementation of the New Jersey Student Learning Standards in 18 Computer Science and Design Thinking. The instruction shall be 19 on the curriculum guidelines established by based the 20 Commissioner of Education pursuant to section 3 of P.L. 21 (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill). The c. 22 instruction shall be included in the curriculum for each grade in a 23 manner adapted to the age and understanding of the students and 24 shall provide a thorough and comprehensive treatment of the 25 subject.

The Commissioner of Education, in consultation with the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness and the New Jersey 28 29 Cybersecurity and Communications Integration Cell, shall develop 30 curriculum guidelines to assist school districts in implementing the 31 instruction on cybersecurity required pursuant to section 2 of 32 P.L., c. (2) information concerning the proper and safe use of the
Internet as well as strategies to detect solicitations of private or
personal information from bad actors and how to protect private or
personal information;

42 (3) an overview of the fundamentals of computer hardware and
43 software as well as information on various computer operating
44 systems;

45 (4) a summary of the basic and advanced skills needed to be
46 successful in the field of cybersecurity, including computer
47 networking and coding;

(5) examples of research projects and other applied activities
 relating to cybersecurity that school districts may offer to students;
 and

(6) information concerning post-secondary opportunities in the
field of cybersecurity as well as other career pathways a student
may pursue in the field of cybersecurity.

The guidelines shall include model instructional units, define
learning objectives, and recommend instructional materials suitable
for each of the grades nine through 12.

The guidelines developed pursuant to this section shall be reviewed annually and shall be updated as appropriate to ensure that the guidelines and the instruction on cybersecurity required pursuant to section 2 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) reflects the most current information available on the field of cybersecurity.

(1) provide a comprehensive sequence of courses that will ensure
adequate preparation for further postsecondary education or a career
in the field of cybersecurity;

40 (3) detail any requirements, other than coursework, that may be41 part of cybersecurity-related degree programs; and

42 (4) detail overall expected student outcomes for cybersecurity43 related degree programs as well as expected student outcomes for

b. A person seeking loan redemption under the program shall
submit an application to the authority pursuant to application

Redemption Program, an applicant shall:

(2) be a teacher of an approved cybersecurity-related subject

The executive director or the executive director's designee shall select the program participants from among those applicants who meet the eligibility criteria established pursuant to section 11 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill), subject to the availability of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to the program.

b. A person who meets the eligibility requirements under section 11 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) and has been selected by the executive director or the executive director's designee for participation in the program shall enter into a written contract with the authority. The contract shall specify the dates of required service by the program participant as a teacher in an approved cybersecurity-related subject matter and

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shall require the program participant to serve at least one year as a
 teacher in an approved cybersecurity-related subject matter.

c. Prior to the annual redemption of loan indebtedness, the
program participant shall submit to the authority certification of
employment in a school district, charter school, or renaissance
school as a teacher of an approved cybersecurity-related subject
matter for the full school year period.

d. A program participant, as a condition of participation, shall
be required to adhere to performance standards established by the
executive director or the executive director's designee.

e. A program participant shall be eligible for participation inthe program for no more than four years.

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14 13. a. A program participant who has previously entered into a 15 contract with the authority may nullify the agreement by notifying 16 the authority in writing and reassuming full responsibility for the 17 remaining outstanding balance of the loan debt. In no event shall 18 employment for less than the full school year entitle the program 19 participant to any benefits under the program.

b. In the case of a program participant's death or total and
permanent disability, the authority shall nullify the employment
obligation of the program participant. The nullification shall
terminate the authority's obligations under the loan redemption
contract. When continued enforcement of the contract may result in
extreme hardship, the authority may nullify or suspend the
employment obligation of the program participant.

c. In the case of a program participant's conviction of a crime
or an act of gross negligence in the performance of employment
obligations, or a program participant's breach of the standards
established pursuant to subsection d. of section 12 of P.L. ,

to terminate the program participant's participation in the program.

14. A person who knowingly or willfully furnishes any false or
misleading information for the purpose of receiving loan
redemption benefits under the program is guilty of a crime of the
fourth degree.

The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and 41 regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," 42 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), necessary to effectuate the 43 provisions of sections 1 through 3 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending 44 before the Legislature as this bill). The Higher Education Student 45 Assistance Authority shall promulgate rules and regulations 46 pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 47 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), necessary to implement the provisions of 48 sections 5 through 9 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the

1 Legislature as this bill). The authority, in consultation with the 2 Department of Education, shall promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 3 4 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), necessary to implement the provisions of 5 sections 10 through 14 of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the 6 Legislature as this bill).

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8 16. This act shall take effect immediately and sections 1 through 9 3 shall first apply in the first full school year following the date of 10 enactment.

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STATEMENT

15 This bill requires school districts to incorporate instruction on 16 cybersecurity in an appropriate place in the curriculum of students 17 in each of the grades nine through 12. The instruction will be based 18 on curriculum guidelines established under the bill by the 19 Commissioner of Education in consultation with the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness and the New Jersey 20 21 Cybersecurity and Communications Integration Cell. The 22 curriculum guidelines would provide for a sequential course of 23 study for each of the grades nine through 12 and include various 24 introductory concepts and activities related to cybersecurity.

25 Under the bill, the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education, 26 in consultation with the Department of Labor and Workforce 27 Development, the Economic Development Authority, the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness, and the New Jersey 28 29 Presidents' Council, would develop a cybersecurity model 30 curriculum for use by four-year institutions of higher education in 31 the State and a cybersecurity model curriculum for use by county 32 colleges in the State. The model curricula developed pursuant 33 would assist four-year institutions of higher education and county 34 colleges in developing cybersecurity-related degree programs. The 35 Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Economic Development Authority, in consultation with the New 36 37 Jersey Presidents' Council, are required to develop and distribute to institutions of higher education cybersecurity career pathway 38 39 marketing materials that provide descriptions of cybersecurity 40 careers and the benefits of pursuing such careers.

41 The bill also creates two student loan redemption programs for 42 individuals seeking careers in cybersecurity-related roles. The 43 Cybersecurity Loan Redemption Program would provide \$1,000 to 44 program participants for each year of employment in a 45 cybersecurity occupation approved by the Executive Director of the 46 Higher Education Student Assistance Authority, up to a maximum 47 of four years, for the redemption of a portion of eligible qualifying 48 loan expenses. Among other requirements enumerated in the bill, a

program participant is required to be graduate of an approved
 cybersecurity degree program at an institution of higher education
 located in New Jersey and be employed in an approved
 cybersecurity occupation with an employer located in the State.

5 The second loan redemption program, the Cybersecurity Teacher 6 Loan Redemption Program, would similarly provide \$1,000 to 7 program participants for each year of service as a teacher in a cybersecurity-related subject matter, as determined by the 8 9 Executive Director of the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority, up to a maximum of four years, for the redemption of a 10 portion of eligible qualifying loan expenses. Among other 11 requirements enumerated in the bill, a program participant is 12 13 required to be a teacher of an approved cybersecurity-related 14 subject matter, who is employed by a school district, charter school, 15 or renaissance school project in the State.
