BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

8 1. Beginning with the 2018-2019 grade nine class, the State 9 Board of Education shall require that the high school graduation 10 requirement on financial literacy includes instruction on available State and federal tuition assistance programs, including grants, 11 12 scholarships, and student loans. The instruction shall incorporate issues associated with student loan debt, the requirements for 13 repayment of that debt, and the consequences of the failure to repay 14 15 student loan debt in a timely manner.

A school district shall ensure that a student enrolled in high 18 school meets with a guidance counselor during either the second or 19 third year of high school to discuss State and federal tuition assistance programs, including grants, scholarships, and student 20 loans, that may be available to the student to finance postsecondary 21 22 educational opportunities. The guidance counselor shall also 23 discuss the options available to the student for dual enrollment in 24 the high school and an institution of higher education that will 25 enable the student to earn college credit while still in high school 26 and reduce the overall cost of a higher education.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

33 This bill provides that beginning with the 2018-2019 grade nine 34 class, the State Board of Education will require that the high school graduation requirement on financial literacy include instruction on 35 36 available State and federal tuition assistance programs, including 37 grants, scholarships, and student loans.
