1 recent Uniform Crime Report prepared by the New Jersey Division
2 of State Police and in six municipalities that are located near ports
3 and have significant minority populations, as determined by the

5 Finally, the bill requires the department to submit a report
6 evaluating the effectiveness of the pilot program to the Governor
7 and the Legislature within 90 days after the completion of the pilot
8 program. The report is to recommend whether the pilot program
9 should be continued, expanded, or made permanent.
