Prohibits use by certain retailers of shipping box greater than two times volume of product being shipped.

 retailers to ship products to consumers and supplementing Title

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

8 1. a. Beginning six months after the effective date of this 9 section, no large online retailer or major retailer in the State shall 10 utilize a shipping box to ship a product to a consumer that is greater 11 than two times the volume of the product being shipped.

12 b. Any large online retailer or major retailer that violates the 13 provisions of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for each offense, to be collected 14 15 in a civil action by summary proceeding under the "Penalty 16 Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.), 17 or in any case before a court of competent jurisdiction wherein 18 injunctive relief has been requested. If the violation is of a continuing nature, each day during which the violation continues 19 20 shall constitute an additional, separate, and distinct offense. The Superior Court and the municipal court shall have jurisdiction to 21 22 enforce the provisions of the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999" in 23 connection with this section.

24 c. The Department of Environmental Protection, the Division of 25 Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and Public Safety, a 26 county, a municipality, or any entity certified pursuant to the 27 "County Environmental Health Act," P.L.1977, c.443 (C.26:3A2-21 et seq.), may institute a civil action for a civil penalty or injunctive 28 29 relief to enforce the provisions of this section or prohibit and 30 prevent a violation thereof, and the court may proceed in the action 31 in a summary manner.

32 d. As used in this section:

33 "Consumer" means a person present in New Jersey who
34 purchases merchandise at retail for personal use and not for
35 purposes of resale.

36 "Large online retailer" means a business that sells goods over the
37 internet, sends goods by mail or parcel delivery, and has annual
38 gross sales equal to or greater than one million dollars in or into the
39 State.

40 "Major retailer" means a retail establishment that occupies at41 least 75,000 square feet and has 50 or more employees.

42 "Shipping box" means a cardboard or corrugated container that
43 has a flat base and sides and is utilized by retailers to ship products
44 to consumers by mail.

This bill would limit the size of shipping boxes that can be utilized by large online retailers and major retailers in the State to ship products to consumers.

6 Specifically, the bill would prohibit any large online retailer or 7 major retailer in the State from utilizing a shipping box to ship a 8 product to a consumer that is greater than two times the volume of 9 the product being shipped.

10 As defined in the bill, "large online retailer" means a business 11 that sells goods over the internet, sends goods by mail or parcel 12 delivery, and has annual gross sales equal to or greater than one 13 million dollars in or into the State, "major retailer" means a retail 14 establishment that occupies at least 75,000 square feet and has 50 or 15 more employees, and "shipping box" means a cardboard or 16 corrugated container that has a flat base and sides and is utilized by 17 retailers to ship products to consumers by mail.

18 A large online retailer or major retailer that violates the bill's 19 provisions would be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$250 20 nor more than \$500 for each offense. In the case of a continuing 21 violation, each day during which the violation continues would 22 constitute an additional, separate, and distinct offense. The bill 23 authorizes the Department of Environmental Protection, the 24 Division of Consumer Affairs in the Department of Law and Public 25 Safety, a county, a municipality, or any entity certified pursuant to 26 the "County Environmental Health Act," P.L.1977, c.443 27 (C.26:3A2-21 et seq.), to institute a summary civil action for a civil 28 penalty or injunctive relief to enforce the bill's provisions or 29 prohibit and prevent a violation thereof.

30 Online shopping has become increasingly popular in recent years 31 due to convenience and advances in technology. However, online 32 shopping has also resulted in environmental consequences that are 33 associated with the shipment and delivery of products to consumers 34 from warehouses on behalf of large online retailers or major 35 retailers. Items purchased online from large online retailers or 36 major retailers require packaging in order to be shipped safely to 37 Often small products purchased from large online consumers. 38 retailers or major retailers are shipped in excessively large shipping 39 boxes which results in large amounts of packaging waste.

40 Online shopping is already responsible for large amounts of 41 packaging waste on a daily basis. To reduce the packaging waste 42 associated with online shopping, it is imperative that large online 43 retailers and major retailers reduce the size of the shipping boxes 44 utilized to ship their products to consumers.
