#### SYNOPSIS

Establishes Office of State Dental Director and New Jersey Oral Health Commission.

#### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As introduced.



1 AN ACT concerning oral health services, amending R.S.45:6-1, and 2 supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. (New section) There is established within the Department of Health the Office of the State Dental Director. The State Dental 8 9 Director shall be appointed by the Governor in consultation with the 10 New Jersey Dental Association. The director shall be a dentist or a 11 dental hygienist licensed in New Jersey who has practiced in the 12 State for at least 10 years. The director may serve in a volunteer or salaried capacity. 13 14 15 2. (New section) a. The State Dental Director shall: 16 (1) Develop and facilitate models of public and private 17 partnerships for oral health awareness campaigns to improve the 18 access, acceptability, and use of oral health services in this State; (2) Serve as an information and resource center for specific oral 19 20 health information and data concerning oral health and disseminate 21 such data to interested parties; 22 (3) In consultation with the Commissioner of Health, review, 23 recommend, and develop, or cause to be developed, appropriate oral 24 health education materials and disseminate the materials to local 25 school districts throughout the State; 26 (4) In collaboration with appropriate State agencies and private 27 organizations, provide, or cause to be provided, assistance to Early 28 Head Start and Head Start programs and local school districts to 29 develop programs in Head Start programs and elementary and 30 secondary schools that stress good nutrition, sound oral hygiene, 31 and healthy lifestyles, as well as the prevention of oral disease; 32 (5) Serve as an advocate for the adoption and implementation of 33 effective measures to improve the oral health of State residents and 34 eliminate disparities among the various racial and ethnic populations of this State concerning access to high-quality oral 35 health care, utilization of oral health care services, and oral health 36 37 status; 38 (6) Develop recommendations for the most effective means of 39 providing outreach to communities throughout the State to ensure 40 their maximum participation in publicly-funded oral health 41 programs; and 42 (7) Evaluate oral health programs in other states to assess their efficacy and potential for replication in this State, and make 43 44 recommendations regarding the adoption of such programs, as

45 appropriate.

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1 The director may apply for and accept any grant of money b. 2 from the federal government, private foundations, or other sources, 3 which may be available for programs related to oral health. Monies 4 may be used from private sources to pay for the salary of the 5 director and to implement the recommendations of the director and the New Jersey Oral Health Commission established under section 3 6 7 of this act. 8 c. The director shall be in charge of all dental health activities 9 and programs that are in or are overseen by the Department of 10 Health. 11 d. The director shall report annually to the Governor and, 12 pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-19.1), to the 13 Legislature, on the work of the director and the New Jersey Oral Health Commission and on the status of oral health in the State. 14 15 3. (New section) a. There is established in the Department of 16 17 Health the New Jersey Oral Health Commission, which shall develop and promote recommendations for policies, events, and 18 awareness campaigns to improve the condition of oral health in this 19 20 State. 21 b. The commission shall comprise 15 members, to be appointed 22 as follows: 23 (1) The State Dental Director, who shall serve as chairperson of 24 the commission; 25 (2) The Commissioners of Banking and Insurance, Children and 26 Families, Education, and Human Services, or their designees, who 27 shall serve ex officio; and (3) 10 public members, who shall be appointed by the Governor 28 29 as follows: one member upon the recommendation of the New Jersey Dental Association; one member upon the recommendation 30 31 of the New Jersey Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatric 32 Dentistry; one member upon the recommendation of the New Jersey 33 Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics; one member upon 34 the recommendation of the Medical Society of New Jersey; one 35 member upon the recommendation of the Rutgers School of Dental 36 Medicine; one member upon the recommendation of the New Jersey 37 Hygienists' Association; one Dental member upon the 38 recommendation of the New Jersey Dental Assistants' Association; 39 one member upon the recommendation of the Arc of New Jersey; 40 and two members upon the recommendation of the New Jersey 41 Association of Health Plans, one of whom shall represent Medicaid 42 managed care organizations and one of whom shall represent the 43 dental insurance industry. 44 The public members shall serve for a term of five years, с. 45 except that, of the 10 public members first appointed, the first three 46 members appointed shall serve for a term of three years, the second 47 three members appointed shall serve for a term of four years, and

48 the next four members appointed shall serve for a term of five

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1 A public member is eligible to be reappointed to the vears. 2 commission. A member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring in the 3 membership of the commission for any reason other than the expiration of the term shall have a term of appointment for the 4 5 unexpired term only. All vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. 6

7 d. The commission shall organize as soon as practicable 8 following the appointment of its members. The chairperson shall 9 appoint a secretary who need not be a member of the commission.

of the commission 10 e. Members shall serve without 11 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses 12 incurred in the performance of their duties.

The commission shall meet at least twice per calendar year, 13 f. 14 and at such other times as the chairperson shall designate.

15 g. The Department of Health shall provide staff services and 16 other necessary support to the commission. The commission may 17 also request the assistance and services of the employees of any 18 State, county, or municipal department, board, bureau, commission, 19 task force, or agency as it may require and as may be available to it 20 for its purposes.

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4. R.S.45:6-1 is amended to read:

23 45:6-1. The State Board of Registration and Examination in 24 Dentistry in the Division of Professional Boards of the Department 25 of Law and Public Safety, hereinafter in this chapter designated as 26 the "board," created and established by an act entitled "An act to 27 regulate the practice of dentistry in the State of New Jersey, and to repeal certain acts now relating to the same," approved March 31, 28 29 1915 (L.1915, c.146, p.261), as amended and supplemented, is 30 continued, and shall hereafter be known and designated as the New 31 Jersey State Board of Dentistry. Wherever in any law, rule, regulation, judicial or administrative proceeding or otherwise, 32 33 reference is made to the State Board of Registration and 34 Examination in Dentistry, the same shall mean and refer to the New 35 Jersey State Board of Dentistry.

36 In addition to the State Dental Director or the director's 37 designee, who shall serve ex officio, and two public members, the board shall consist of nine members, eight of whom shall have 38 39 resided and practiced dentistry in this State for at least 10 years 40 each immediately preceding their appointments and one of whom 41 shall be a dental hygienist appointed by the Governor for a term of 42 4 years. In appointing such dental hygienist, the Governor shall 43 give due consideration to, but shall not be bound by, the 44 recommendation of the New Jersey Dental Hygienists Association. 45 Upon the expiration of the term of office of any member, [his] the 46 member's successor shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to 47 the provisions of section 45:1-2 of this Title, for a term of 4 years, 48 except that the successors of the members whose terms will expire

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on June 4, 1949, shall be appointed each for a term expiring on

August 31, 1952; the successors of the members whose terms will

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3 expire on November 9, 1949, and January 7, 1950, respectively, 4 shall be appointed each for a term expiring on August 31, 1953; the 5 successors of the members whose terms will expire on July 31, 1950, and October 8, 1950, respectively, shall be appointed each for 6 7 a term expiring on August 31, 1954; and the successors of the 8 members whose terms will expire on July 30, 1951, and November 9 4, 1951, respectively, shall be appointed each for a term expiring on 10 August 31, 1955. (cf: P.L.1979, c.46, s.22) 17 18 19 5. This act shall take effect on the 90th day following 20 enactment. 21 22 23 **STATEMENT** 24 This bill establishes the Office of the State Dental Director. The 25 26 State Dental Director will be appointed by the Governor in 27 consultation with the New Jersey Dental Association, and will be a 28 licensed dentist or dental hygienist who has practiced in New Jersey 29 for at least 10 years. 30 The State Dental Director will be responsible for developing and 31 facilitating model public and private partnerships for oral health awareness campaigns to improve the access, acceptability, and use of 32 33 oral health services in this State. The director will additionally serve 34 as an information and resource center for specific oral health 35 information and data concerning oral health, and will disseminate such 36 data to interested parties. 37 In consultation with the Commissioner of Health, the director is to 38 review, recommend, and develop appropriate oral health education 39 materials and disseminate the materials to local school districts 40 throughout the State. In collaboration with appropriate State agencies 41 and private organizations, the director is to assist in developing 42 programs in Head Start programs and elementary and secondary 43 schools that stress good nutrition, sound oral hygiene, healthy 44 lifestyles, and the prevention of oral disease. 45 The director will serve as an advocate for the adoption and 46 implementation of effective measures to improve oral health and 47 eliminate disparities among the various racial and ethnic populations 48 of this State concerning access to high-quality oral health care,

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utilization of oral health care services, and oral health status. The director will develop recommendations for the most effective means of providing community outreach to ensure maximum participation in publicly-funded oral health programs, evaluate oral health programs in other states to assess their efficacy and potential for replication in this State, and make recommendations regarding the adoption of such programs.

8 The director will be in charge of all dental health activities and 9 programs that are in or overseen by the Department of Health, and 10 the director or a designee will serve as an additional, ex officio 11 member of the New Jersey State Board of Dentistry.

The director may apply for and accept any grant of money from
the federal government, private foundations, or other sources, which
may be available for programs related to oral health.

Additionally, the bill establishes the New Jersey Oral Health 15 16 Commission in the Department of Health. The commission will be 17 required to develop and promote recommendations for policies, 18 events, and awareness campaigns to improve the condition of oral 19 health in this State. The commission will comprise 15 members, 20 including the State Dental Director, who will serve as chairperson 21 of the commission; the Commissioners of Banking and Insurance, 22 Children and Families, Education, and Human Services, or their 23 designees, who shall serve ex officio; and 10 public members, to be 24 appointed by the Governor upon the recommendations of groups 25 representing various aspects of the health care and dental care 26 industry. The public members will serve for a term of five years, 27 except that, of the 10 public members first appointed, the first three 28 members appointed will serve for a term of three years, the second 29 three members appointed will serve for a term of four years, and the 30 next four members appointed will serve for a term of five years. A 31 public member is eligible to be reappointed to the commission, and 32 vacancies will be filled in the same manner as the original 33 appointment.

Members of the commission will serve without compensation, but will be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The commission will meet at least twice per calendar year, and at such other times as the chairperson designates. The Department of Health will provide staff services and other necessary support to the commission.

41 Legislature on the work of the director and the commission and on
42 the status of oral health in the State.
