Requires public works contractor registration and payroll certification for public works projects to be completed online.

1 AN ACT concerning the online registration of public works 2 contractors and online submission of payroll certification and 3 amending P.L.1999, c.238 and P.L.1963, c.150. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. Section 5 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.52) is amended to 9 read as follows: 10 5. a. A contractor shall register [in writing] electronically with 11 the department on [a] an online form provided by the 12 commissioner. The form shall require the following information: 13 (1) The name, principal business address and telephone number 14 of the contractor; 15 (2) Whether the contractor is a corporation, partnership, sole 16 proprietorship, or other form of business entity; 17 (3) If the contractor's principal business address is not within the State, the name and address of the contractor's custodian of records 18 19 and agent for service of process in this State; 20 (4) The name and address of each person with a financial 21 interest in the contractor and the percentage interest, except that if 22 the contractor is a publicly-traded corporation, the contractor shall 23 supply the names and addresses of the corporation's officers; 24 (5) The contractor's identification number tax and 25 unemployment insurance registration number; 26 (6) A certification form provided by the commissioner, with 27 documentation satisfactory to the commissioner, that the contractor has all valid and effective licenses, registrations or certificates 28 29 required by State law, including registrations or certifications 30 required to do business in the State of New Jersey, and the 31 contractor, if directly employing craftworkers, participates in a 32 registered apprenticeship program as defined in section 3 of P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.50) for each craft they employ; and 33 34 (7) Any other relevant and appropriate information as 35 determined by the commissioner. b. At the time of registration, and subsequently upon request, 36 the contractor shall submit to the commissioner documentation 37 demonstrating that the contractor has worker's compensation 38 39 insurance coverage for all workers as required by law. 40 (cf: P.L.2019, c.21, s.2) 41 2. Section 5 of P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.29) is amended to 42 43 read as follows: 44 5. a. Every contractor and subcontractor shall keep an accurate 45 record showing the name, craft or trade, and actual hourly rate of 46 wages paid to each worker employed by him in connection with [a] EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

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1 public work and such records shall be preserved for two years from 2 date of payment. The record shall be open at all reasonable hours to 3 the inspection of the public body awarding the contract, to any other 4 party to the lease or agreement to lease pursuant to which the public 5 work is done, union worker representatives, and to the 6 commissioner. 7 b. (1) The department shall provide on its Internet website a 8 secure process for the online submission of payroll records and a 9 process for the inspection of those records by the public body 10 awarding the contract, to any other party to the lease or agreement 11 to lease pursuant to which the public work is done, union worker 12 representatives, and to the commissioner. 13 (2) Payrolls records shall be posted by a contractor or 14 subcontractor subject to this section within 10 days of the date in 15 which the wages were paid to a worker. The contractor or 16 subcontractor shall use the department's website to submit the 17 records required to be maintained pursuant to subsection a. of this 18 section to the department. 19 (3) Contractors shall be required to provide payroll records to 20 both the department through online submission and to the public 21 body awarding the contract. Online payroll record submission to the 22 department does not relieve the contractor of the requirement to 23 submit payroll records to the public body awarding the contract. 24 The public body awarding the contract shall be entitled to original, 25 unredacted payroll submissions. 26 (4) Records submitted pursuant to this subsection shall be 27 subject to the commissioner's powers provided by section 7 of 28 P.L.1963, c.150 (C.34:11-56.31). 29 (cf: P.L.1990, c.27, s.4) 30 31 3. This act shall take effect on the 365th day following 32 enactment. 33 34 35 **STATEMENT** 36 37 This bill requires public works contractor registration and payroll 38 certification for public works projects to be completed online. 39 Current law requires public works contractors to register in writing. 40 current law provides that contractors Additionally, and 41 subcontractors shall keep an accurate and detailed record of payroll 42 activities and that the record shall be kept open for inspection by 43 the public body awarding the contract. This bill establishes 44 mandatory online contractor registration and payroll certification 45 processes. This bill does not relieve the contractor of the 46 requirement to submit payroll records directly to the public body

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- 1 awarding the contract. Under the bill public works contractors will
- 2 no longer submit registration applications or payroll certification on
- 3 written paper forms.
