

## Discussion Points

1. Federal enactments and budget proposals often significantly impact State programs and fiscal resources. The Department of Law and Public Safety anticipates receiving \$195.3 million in federal funds in FY 2012, which is a decrease of \$26.5 million from the estimated FY 2011 federal funding of \$221.8 million.

- **Question:** What specific increases or decreases in federal funding, including all in-but-not-of offices of the Department of Law and Public Safety, are anticipated in FY 2012? Are any of these funds in jeopardy given recent Federal budget developments? What specific new or revised federal mandates or matching requirements are expected? What impact would these changes have on the department's resources and activities in FY 2012? Please provide details regarding any local impact from these changes.

### Department Proper

During the technical budget process, the Department did not request budget authority for the following programs, as not enough information on the federal budget was available at the time. As a result, the FY 2012 Governor's Budget Recommendation includes a reduction in federal funding, totaling \$40.443 million, which consist of:

- \$22.5 million–Severe Repetitive Loss–FEMA;
- \$5.347 million–Emergency Operations Center;
- \$1.91 million–Port Security–Delaware Bay (South);
- \$1.8 million–Repetitive Flood Claim Program–FEMA;
- \$1.7 million–Port Security–New York/New Jersey (North);
- \$1.5 million–Port Security–Elizabeth Station (ARRA);
- \$1.5 million–Safety Belt Performance Grants;
- \$1.1 million–Community Oriented Policing (COPS)–SP/NJN Grant;
- \$1.0 million–Hazard Mitigation Grant Program;
- \$1.0 million–Racial Profiling Prevention;
- \$450,000–Housing and Urban Development;
- \$278,000–Cold Case–National Institute of Justice;
- \$187,000–Operation Stonegarden;
- \$75,000–Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention;
- \$23,000–IDEA–Handicapped; and
- \$73,000–Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program.

The above reductions were offset by projected grants totaling \$13.92 million, for the following programs:

- \$9.967 million–Urban Area Security Initiative,
- \$2.942 million – Homeland Security Grant Program;
- \$500,000–Victim Compensation Award;
- \$206,000–Title 1–Part D, Neglected & Delinquent;
- \$70,000–Incident Command;
- \$76,000–State Traffic Safety Information System;
- \$74,000–Juvenile Accountability Incentive Block Grant;

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- \$55,000–Motorcycle Safety;
- \$20,000–Paul Coverdell National Forensic Science Improvement; and
- \$10,000–Solving Cold Cases.

The Department recently submitted the federal fund update, which reflects the following increases to anticipated federal funding, based on the President's budget:

- \$27.451 million–Severe Repetitive Loss–FEMA;
- \$14 million–COPS Hiring Program;
- \$3.42 million–Port Security–New York/New Jersey;
- \$1.7 million–Port Security–Delaware Bay;
- \$1.2 million–Distracted Driver Incentive; and
- \$400,000–Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act.

The department continues to apply for eligible federal grants.

While it is very difficult to predict at this point, the criminal justice field (association) anticipates at least a 20 percent reduction or more in the Justice Assistance Grant program for FY 2012. There is clear indication at this time that the Violence Against Women Act funding may also be subject to cuts. The Victims of Crime Act funding is generated from fines and penalties levied against criminals convicted of federal crimes, so the funding level may not be affected.

A reduction in federal funding levels will impact the funding and resources the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ) provides to state, county, local and nonprofit agencies. Each of the federal funding programs administered by the DCJ has its own duration period spanning several years. In light of this proposed reduction, the DCJ would have to reduce the funding that supports law enforcement and other criminal justice initiatives, and victim services including the 21 County Prosecutors' Offices of Victim Witness Advocacy and the many nonprofit agencies providing direct services to victims of crime.

The Division of Highway Traffic Safety (HTS) anticipates approximately \$12 million to be available for highway traffic initiatives. However, the HTS's federal partners have indicated that funding may be reduced in FY 2012. As a result, the office plans on accepting applications for grant funding totaling no more than \$11 to \$11.5 million. This has caused the HTS to prioritize its initiatives, and in some cases, funding levels for individual projects will be reduced.

### **Juvenile Justice Commission ("JJC")**

FY 2012 federal funds have not been awarded yet, but JJC anticipates a 17% reduction in Juvenile Accountability Block Grants, Title II, and Title V appropriations. New Jersey receives Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention ("JJDP") Act Funds and utilizes Title II Formula Grant Funds to provide prevention, intervention and aftercare programming to juveniles in communities across the state. Funding priorities of the State Advisory Group ("SAG") include addressing: truancy, reentry services for youth, the unique needs of juvenile females, the rates

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at which Black and Hispanic youth appear at various juvenile justice system decision making points, as well as, primary prevention through summer programming and Title V prevention programs.

Additionally, Juvenile Accountability Block Grant funds that are provided to the state, 21 counties and four (4) municipalities, are used to provide sanctions and services to youth at points on the juvenile justice continuum from prevention through reentry.

The proposed reduction in funding could result in the SAG not addressing all of the priorities identified and would result in reduced number of youth being served in New Jersey at the State level, in our counties and our municipalities.

### Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness

On Friday, April 15, 2011, President Obama signed continuing resolution HR 1473 into law. The bill funds the federal government through the remainder of FFY 2011 (September 30, 2011) and provides funding levels for the various homeland security grant programs managed by the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness (OHSP).

The Homeland Security Grant Program consists of the following – the State Homeland Security Program (“SHSP”), Citizen Corps, the Urban Area Security Initiative (“UASI”), the non-profit Urban Area Security Initiative, the Metropolitan Medical Response System (“MMRS”), the Regional Catastrophic Program Grant (“RCPG”), the Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program (“IECGP”), the Emergency Operations Center (“EOC”) grant, and the Buffer Zone Protection Program (“BZPP”). OHSP projects being awarded approximately \$51 million under the FFY 2011 (SFY 2012) funding cycle or a reduction of approximately 32% when compared to FFY 2010 (SFY 2011) levels for the same grant programs. (Note the figures exclude the Emergency Management Performance Grant (“EMPG”) funding, which is now awarded directly to the Division of State Police.

While this reduction will not significantly impact OHSP’s spending plan and budget, it will impede and may curtail homeland security investments at the local level since the majority of this funding (80%) is required to be passed down to local units of governments. The OHSP does fund full-time equivalents within its own organization as well as in several state agencies for which reduced federal dollars will ultimately impact the number of state level homeland security projects OHSP will be able to fund.

Nationwide, the State Homeland Grant Program, the major source of grant funding to all 21 counties, has been reduced from \$890 million to \$580 million -- a reduction of approximately 35%.

In FFY 2010, the OHSP received \$23,804,549 from the State Homeland Grant Program. A 35% reduction would equate to the Office receiving approximately \$15.5 million in SFY 2011 -- a cut of \$8.3 million. The reduction may in fact be greater due to the U.S. Department of Homeland

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Security (“DHS”) altering their funding equation for FFY 2011. The exact numbers will be released by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in mid-May.

In addition, nationwide the Urban Areas Security Initiative (“UASI”) grant program was funded at \$868 million in FFY 2010. The FFY 2011 funding for the UASI grant will be \$706 million – a reduction of approximately 19%. The Office projects the UASI program will be funded at \$31.6 million -- a drop of nearly \$6 million. The New Jersey UASI region consists of seven (7) counties: Bergen, Passaic, Morris, Hudson, Essex, Union, and Middlesex and the principal cities of Newark and Jersey City. It is one of sixty-four UASI’s (designation made by DHS) in the country and only one of ten “Tier 1” UASI’s. (Tier 1 relates to highest-risk areas.) This drop in UASI grant funding will seriously impede some of the programs that the UASI region engages in, such as responding to a catastrophic event.

- **Question:** Please provide a final analysis of federal ARRA funding which passed through the department and how it assisted the citizens of New Jersey.

The chart below details the federal stimulus funding and status of the Department’s awards.

2a. The Attorney General mentioned during the FY 2011 Department of Law and Public Safety Budget Hearings that the Division of Law employed 466 Deputy Attorney Generals, a decrease of 128 from 2006. The Attorney General further noted that they had 40,000 legal matters pending at any given time and 15,000 cases in actual litigation.

- **Question:** What is the current staffing complement in the Division of Law? Please provide an assessment of the optimal staffing complement and the challenges, if any, in attaining that staffing level. Please provide the estimated costs associated with achieving that staffing level.

As of April 26, 2011, the Division of Law has 452 deputy attorneys general performing legal services for its client agencies. The FY 2012 attorney staffing complement is 480. This staffing level can be achieved and maintained with the current Direct State Services funding level and client services agreements.

2b. The Division of Law is advertising a *Volunteer Associate Program* for lawyers who are interested in public service in New Jersey. The program calls for the assistance of “recent graduates and admitted attorneys” who are willing to make a volunteer commitment of 20 hours per week for three months.

- **Question:** Please provide background on the division’s *Volunteer Associate Program*. Please provide the number of volunteers who applied to the program, the number that were accepted, and the average length of the volunteer commitment made by the volunteers. Please provide an overview of how the division’s caseload has been impacted. Please estimate the cost savings, if any, from the program.

In September 2009, the Division of Law launched the Volunteer Associates in Public Service Program. Since the program’s inception, 239 attorneys have applied for the program and more than 130 attorneys have participated thus far. Each volunteer made a commitment to work for at least three (3) months, for a minimum of 20 hours each week. On average, volunteers have served four (4) to six (6) months. It has been estimated that the volunteers together have donated more than 50,000 hours of legal services. Applying the Division’s lowest billing rate of \$78 per hour, this equates to a savings of \$3.9 million. The volunteers have served in virtually every section of the Division of Law, doing a broad range of legal work.

2c. Annually, the department outsources cases and assignments retaining outside counsel for various reasons. The department also enters into client service agreements with other departments to handle legal cases through outside counsel.

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- **Question:** Please provide a list of cases and assignments, by department, for which outside counsel was retained, including the amount paid by case for FY 2010 and FY 2011 thus far. What amount is budgeted in FY 2012 for the services of outside counsel?

The total annual amount paid by state agencies for outside counsel services ranges from \$21 million to \$26 million. The attached reports (Attachment A and B) detail the expenditures for FY 2010 and FY 2011 (as of February 1, 2011).

3. In *Freeman v. Corzine*, the Third Circuit held that a provision of the State's alcoholic beverage laws (N.J.S.A. 33:1-10) contravenes the dormant Commerce Clause of the United States Constitution by allowing New Jersey wineries to sell directly to consumers, while subjecting out-of-state wineries to the three tier system. Similarly, this provision which allows New Jersey wineries, but not out-of-state wineries, to sell directly to retailers was also found to be facially discriminatory against interstate commerce.

- **Question:** What is the budget impact of complying with the recent decisions? What is the cost of enforcement regarding the collection of taxes and permits for out-of-state wineries?

The Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control does not measure the revenue generated by economic activity in the alcoholic beverage industry. There is no present significant impact on State revenues.

As for licensing, fees generated by New Jersey wineries are fairly insignificant to the Division's budget. This Division does not assess or analyze State sales tax revenue and has no data regarding the current tax revenue. Pursuant to statute however, a significant percentage of the excise tax collected from the production of wine is returned to the wineries in the form of grants. Accordingly, if there were to be a decrease in wine sales, the net effect on excise taxes would be small.

The Division does not collect taxes and cannot opine as to the cost of collection and enforcement.

4a. The Division of State Police has many duties and missions to fulfill in various venues: forensic services, air ambulance, marine and highway safety, homeland security, and general police protection services to name only a few.

In FY 2011, it was determined that a new State Police recruit class would be delayed until FY 2012, however \$500,000 was provided to undertake a preliminary selection process. The Governor's FY 2012 budget recommends funding to train one new class of State Police recruits beginning in August 2011 and concluding in January of 2012.

The FY 2011 budget reflected that 452 troopers are eligible to retire at a savings of \$5.387 million by the end of 2011 and the department estimated a \$2 million savings from the

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reallocation of State Police to reduce overtime. Furthermore, two years have passed since a new recruit class has occurred.

- **Question:** Please provide a breakout of State Police staffing allocations, by division and unit, and also indicate the number of civilian staff in each. Please provide the number of troopers eligible for retirement in the next ten years, by year. For the five year period between 2005-2010, please state by year the number of troopers that were, as of January 1, 2006 and subsequently thereafter became eligible to retire, the number that actually retired, and the length of time that elapsed between retirement eligibility and actual retirement for each retiree. Please provide a statistical breakdown by gender and ethnicity within the Division of State Police as of the close of FY 2010.

- Question: What is the department’s FY 2012 spending plan for new State Police recruit classes? In what step of the hiring process is the department currently? At this time, are a sufficient number of pre-qualified applicants available to begin an August 2011 class?**

The spending plan for training the 151<sup>st</sup> State Police Class is approximately \$3 million. Background investigations are currently being conducted on 224 applicants, which is expected to yield a sufficient number of individuals to begin the August class.

- Question: Please provide an overview of how the Division of State Police has reallocate staff to reduce staff overtime. Will the FY 2011 overtime savings goal be met? If not, by what amount will it fall short?**



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The Division of State Police developed a strategy that included first line supervisors to aggressively monitor overtime. The "eDaily" electronic time keeping system, utilized by enlisted State Police members, was enhanced to provide a reporting mechanism available to supervisors, which allowed them to identify when unscheduled hours were occurring and for what purposes. This initiative resulted in a \$2 million savings in FY 2011. By adjusting schedules and returning accrued time when possible, the State Police has managed to meet the stated overtime reduction goal year to date. The Division's plan did not include a reallocation of staff.

5. The Department of Law and Public Safety has noted that the State was engaged in negotiations to purchase three to five new helicopters to replace an aging air ambulance and law enforcement fleet. According to the Attorney General, the Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program received one helicopter March 30 and expect one more in April 2012 to be delivered. The Governor's FY 2012 budget estimates revenue of \$14 million, over two years from the sale of older helicopters.

- **Question: What is the department's spending plan for the New Jersey Emergency Medical Service Helicopter Response Program Fund in FY 2010, FY 2011, and FY 2012? Please provide an update of the State's helicopter fleet purchases, including dates of expected receipt. Please include the number of days in FY 2010, and thus far in FY 2011, that each aircraft in the fleet was grounded for maintenance and repair. What is the estimated annual cost of fleet maintenance for FY 2010 and FY 2011? Please provide the average cost per flight.**

The spending plan for the Medical Service Helicopter Response Program is \$11.94 million in FY 2010, \$15.262 million in FY 2011, and \$18.795 million in FY 2012. Two (2) of the five (5) new Agusta helicopters have been delivered on March 30, 2011 and April 19, 2011. The remaining three (3) helicopters are expected to be delivered in June 2011, October 2011, and Spring 2012.

The Sikorskys were removed from service for maintenance and annual inspections for 50 working days in FY 2010 and are on pace for the same time frame in FY 2011. Each Bell helicopter was removed from service for 23 working days in FY 2010 and is also on pace for a similar amount of time in FY 2011.

The annual maintenance cost for FY 2010 was \$3.261 million and is estimated at \$2.6 million for FY 2011. The hourly operating cost is \$2,298 per hour for the Sikorshys, \$495 per hour for the Bell Long Ranger, and \$406 per hour for the Bell OH-58. At this time, no maintenance costs are attributable to the Agusta helicopters.

- **Question: Please provide an overview of the FY 2011 sale (\$7 million) and anticipated FY 2012 sale (\$7 million) of State helicopters which is predicted to bring the department an estimated \$14 million over two years. Please confirm if the State has located ready-to-purchase buyers for the MedEvac helicopters.**

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As of April 2011, one (1) Bell helicopter has been sold, which generated \$577,800 in net revenue. A second Bell helicopter sale is anticipated to be completed before the close of FY 2011. Due to the current fiscal climate, it appears that stronger demand exists for the smaller Bells as opposed to the Sikorskys.

The helicopter sales are handled by the Department of the Treasury, Division of Surplus Property. To date, the State has not located any ready-to-purchase buyers for the MedEvac helicopters.

6. The Governors' Highway Safety Association published a recent report which analyzes states' fatality numbers for the first six months of 2010. In this report, it appears that New Jersey's number of pedestrian fatalities decreased in the first six months of 2010 compared to 2009.

As of April 1, 2010, a new law was enacted (N.J.S.A 39:4-36) which requires motorists to stop for pedestrians in crosswalks versus simply yielding. This law was enacted due to a considerable number of pedestrian deaths in New Jersey, 157 in 2009. Both pedestrians and motorists may receive fines for failure to comply with the new law.

**• Question: Please provide an overview of the Division of Highway and Traffic Safety's pedestrian safety program. Please provide the final pedestrian fatality numbers for 2010. Please provide the number of citations issued since April 2010 for violations of N.J.S.A 39:4-32, N.J.S.A 39:4-33, and N.J.S.A 39:4-36. How much revenue has been deposited in the Pedestrian Safety Enforcement and Education Fund which was created under N.J.S.A 39:4-36.2?**

The Division of Highway Traffic Safety's Pedestrian Safety Program aims to reduce crashes, injuries, and fatalities involving pedestrians. In Calendar Year ("CY") 2010, there were 141 pedestrian fatalities in New Jersey. For the 10-year period (CY 2001- CY 2010), there were 1,495 pedestrians killed in the state, which comprised 21.5% of all motor vehicle-related fatalities in New Jersey during that period. This compares to a rate of 11% nationally.

The Division's Pedestrian Safety Program consists of two (2) primary components: grants to municipalities that experience high rates of pedestrian crashes, and a statewide public awareness campaign.

The Division's Pedestrian Safety Grant program provides funding to police agencies to undertake special, targeted enforcement operations at high-risk pedestrian locations in their community. These enforcement operations include individual officer details as well as multi-officer decoy details, also known as the "Cops in Crosswalks" program. The grants also provide funding for pedestrian safety educational efforts on the local level, targeting high-risk pedestrian groups including children, senior citizens, and non-English speaking residents.

The Division's statewide public awareness campaign, called "Pedestrian Safety: A Shared Responsibility" aims to spread the message that both motorists and pedestrians themselves

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must do their part to lessen pedestrian crashes. The campaign is supported by informational materials for distribution, earned media campaigns, and a web presence.

The Division does not have access to summons-related information. This information can be obtained through the Judiciary.

As of mid April 2011, there is a balance of \$544,397 in the Pedestrian Safety Enforcement and Education Fund and the Division has obligated a total of \$349,059 in grants out of the fund.

7. The State of New Jersey experienced several heavy snowfalls this fiscal year which created additional expenses for the State. The FY 2011 budget identified certain efficiencies under the Division of State Police. Specifically, a \$1.3 million savings from FY 2010 was anticipated from using in-house maintenance instead of using outside contractors for the same services.

• **Question: Based on the anticipated savings, and the severe weather conditions, did the department meet this efficiency goal? Please explain. What, if any, other unforeseen Department of Law and Public Safety expenses occurred due to FY 2011 weather conditions? Are any federal funding resources available to assist the State, and if so, has the State accessed those resources? If so, please explain.**

The \$1.3 million in FY 2011 savings was attributable to cancelling the Meridian service contract and hiring tradesmen to perform specialty service functions (i.e. electricians, pipe fitters, boiler operators, etc.) at the Emergency Operations Center and Hamilton Technology Complex. The Division anticipates achieving this savings in FY 2011. These tradesmen do not function as general in-house maintenance.

The missions of the State Police are multi-faceted, and the operations of the division continually adjust to meet a multitude of evolving challenges, including dangerous weather conditions. Troopers are trained to serve the public in a response mode during storms, and they assist a multitude of motorists throughout the State during the winter.

The State Emergency Operations Center at Division Headquarters was activated during the recent, severe storms, and interacted with county and local offices of emergency management to provide resources to areas that were experiencing life threatening situations.

New Jersey received a presidential disaster declaration determination (referred to as DR-1954-NJ) for the December 2010 snow storm. The State has applied to the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") for a 75% reimbursement to the division for overtime and ancillary expenses related to the storms.

8. The Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA), passed as part of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, created standards for sex offender registration and notification programs. According to the U.S. Department of Justice, only four

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states (Delaware, Florida, Ohio, and South Dakota) have implemented SORNA. There are several other States which appear to be in the process of complying

As reported by the National Criminal Justice Association in 2011, states and territories failing to substantially implement SORNA by July 27, 2011 will lose 10 percent of their Byrne Justice Assistance Grant program formula grant annually beginning in FFY 2012.

- **Question: Please provide a status update on New Jersey's plans to implement SORNA. Please provide the estimated costs associated with complying, as well as not complying, with SORNA.**

The Department submitted to the federal government on behalf of New Jersey a letter of intent to substantially comply with SORNA, and was granted a one-year extension to July 26, 2011 for implementation. All non-complying state and territories have been granted this extension. The Department has been in regular contact with the Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, Apprehending, Registering and Tracking (the "SMART Office") in the U.S. Department of Justice concerning implementation issues. New Jersey is in the process of determining if legislation is necessary to amend our current sex offender registration and Internet publication laws to conform to the requirements of SORNA, and establish procedures to implement the law in accordance with the federal guidelines.

Compliance with SORNA will require the Division of State Police ("DSP") to make a major overhaul of the current sex offender registry system, converting from a mainframe to a web-based application, utilizing digital fingerprinting and photographing, and the electronic submission of registry information to the DSP for inclusion in the sex offender registry database. The magnitude of this task will be mitigated by the availability of the Sex Offender Registry Tool ("SORT"), a sex offender management application provided by the SMART Office at no cost to assist states in implementing the SORNA registry system requirements. SORT serves the dual purposes of providing a publicly-accessible sex offender Internet registry and functioning as the state-level administrative registry for entering information into the sex offender registry database. The SMART Office is currently adapting SORT for use with the JAVA system utilized by DSP at no cost to the State.

As far as direct costs in the coming fiscal year, DSP will be required to adapt its current sex offender registry database computer system to perform the tasks required by SORNA, which is estimated at approximately \$900,000. This figure does not include the cost of ongoing maintenance, or training for local law enforcement officers who will be required to perform data entry and registration tasks on the new system, or the purchase of new hardware and software (such as scanners, mug shot software or digital cameras) required for local police to take information and register offenders. There may be federal assistance available to help defray some of these costs, such as the Support of Adam Walsh Act Implementation Grant Program, which provides grants of up to \$400,000 for states to enhance and facilitate SORNA implementation.

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Additionally, there will be indirect costs associated with SORNA compliance that are difficult to estimate at the time. For example, prosecutors' offices will be required to expend resources to determine and notify current Megan's Law registrants of their new registration obligations under SORNA, with likely attendant legal challenges. Other indirect systemic costs are likely to rise, as the number of sex offenders required to register will increase, as will the frequency of in-person verification appearances by the overall sex offender population. Relatedly, there will be more criminal prosecutions for violations of the registration law (failure to register, or to update information, or to provide travel information, etc.) and, concomitantly, more custodial sentences.

Failure to substantially comply with the requirements of SORNA will result in a reduction of 10% of State-allocated federal funds under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program. The portion of the FY 2011 federal JAG funding appropriation allocated to the State of New Jersey is expected to be approximately \$6 million. Assuming a similar Byrne JAG allocation in FY 2012, the loss to New Jersey would be approximately \$600,000 for failure to comply with SORNA. Going forward, this 10% reduction would apply every year, unless and until the State were to come into compliance.

10a. The Division of Consumer Affairs supervises the activities of 41 boards and committees, regulating more than 80 professions and occupations. The FY 2012 budget noted that the division was estimated to oversee 489,570 licenses. In FY 2009, in the Operation of State Professional Boards over \$95 million was estimated to be carried forward into FY 2010. In FY 2008, over \$80 million was carried forward into FY 2009.

- **Question: Please provide a list of expenditures and revenues anticipated for FY 2011 for each of the 41 boards and commissions. Please provide an explanation of the extensive annual unexpended balances in professional licensing board accounts. What is the total projected unexpended balances at the close of FY 2011?**

Attached is a summary of the projected FY 2011 expenditures and revenues for all Professional Boards (Attachment C).

Each board has its own licensing cycle, most being biennial and some on a triennial cycle. Some boards have multiple licensing categories with different cycles. To be able to renew licenses efficiently, the expiration date for each license type has been staggered so that all licenses do not expire on the same date. At the time of renewal, the board is required to collect sufficient revenues to support its operation for the upcoming licensing cycle which may be 24 or 36 months. As such, there should always be a significant amount of monies going forward at the end of a fiscal year to cover operations until the licensing cycle is complete. As each board's licensing cycles is different, the amount of monies collected that need to go forward are different for each board.

Budgets for each board are prepared at the end of the fiscal year. The fiscal year end carry forward for each board will increase and then alternately decrease dependent on the number of months until the end of a licensing cycle. If at the end of a licensing cycle there is

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excess revenue projected, the Division will either issue a credit to the licensee upon renewal of their license or decrease the fee by regulation.

10b. The Division of Consumer Affairs enforces laws regarding consumer safety with the State. Additionally, many counties and municipalities have established their own consumer affairs offices.

- **Question:** Please provide the number of investigators for each county and local consumer affairs office. Please indicate the number of investigations which are conducted by each office annually. Please provide which offices proactively conduct investigations versus only respond to complaints. Please provide a breakout of the fines and penalties collected by these offices and describe how the revenue is allocated between the State and locals. Please describe the coordination, if any, between the State and local offices regarding investigations and any other activities.

Any fines or penalties generated by the county and municipal offices are not shared with the State.

**Coordination between Consumer Affairs and County and Local Consumer Affairs' Offices**

In 1960, the New Jersey Consumer Fraud Act ("CFA") was enacted and all enforcement authority was granted to the Attorney General. Seven years later, the Office of Consumer Protection ("OCP") was created as a Bureau within the Department of Law and Public Safety's Division of Law. The creation of OCP led to the complete transfer of all consumer protection authority under the CFA from the AG to OCP. One of OCP's most essential functions was to assist in the coordination of federal, state, and municipal activities relating to consumer affairs. In 1971, the Division of Consumer Affairs ("Consumer Affairs") was created. With the establishment of Consumer Affairs, all of OCP's functions, powers and duties to enforce the CFA were transferred to this division.

In 1976, Consumer Affairs' ability to investigate and enforce the CFA was enhanced by the legislature when it provided that each county and municipality in this State would be authorized to create and establish an office of consumer affairs to be administered by a Director of Consumer Affairs appointed by the county or municipal governing body ("CALA"). In addition, the governing body of the county or municipality was given authority to employ persons to staff the office. In order to qualify as a director or staff employee/representative, the legislature provided that each would be required to successfully complete initial educational and training courses as established by the Director of Consumer Affairs and any required supplemental courses. To date, Consumer Affairs' investigative staff and Deputy Attorneys General who represent OCP have been providing instruction to ensure that county and local consumer affairs' representatives are meaningfully trained to work, side by side and collaboratively, with state consumer protection staff to ensure protection of the consuming public. Through the combined efforts of Consumer Affairs and this "CALA Network," consumers have had the benefit of both state and local consumer protection efforts.

## Discussion Points (Cont'd)

11. Federal funding through the Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant (RCPG) has been awarded directly to New Jersey in FFY 08, FFY 09 and FFY 10. In FFY 09 and FFY 10 it appears that this funding was requested to be directly allocated to the New York State Office of Homeland Security to support regional planning initiatives.

- **Question: Please provide a copy of the investment justification of the grant being sent to New York. Please describe how New Jersey is better served by directing our federal funds to New York versus spending these resources directly.**

As a prerequisite to releasing funds for the Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program ("RCPG") at the initiation of the program in FFY 2008, the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") required that a single State Administrative Agency ("SAA") handle the funds. This was done since the grant was deemed a regional project and not an individual state effort. New Jersey, New York and FEMA engaged in discussions over how best to handle the money and it was agreed that New York State would be the direct recipient of the FFY 2008 funding. In return, New York agreed not to collect the permissible management and administrative costs normally provided to the SAA.

Pursuant to the FEMA guidance for the RCPG, the funding was not for New York or New Jersey but rather for the Northern New Jersey Urban Areas Security Initiative ("UASI") and the New York City UASI as well as the Metropolitan Statistical Areas ("MSA") (determined by FEMA) surrounding the UASI's, which include Westchester and Nassau Counties in New York, Southern Connecticut, and Pike County Pennsylvania. To ensure appropriate representation by all jurisdictions, a Regional Catastrophic Planning Team ("RCPT") was established with representation from the four (4) states, both UASI's, and the MSA communities. It is this body that has determined which projects would receive funding.

As the SAA, New York's role is to pass the funding through to a mutually agreed-upon entity, Public Health Solutions, a not-for-profit administrative support organization, which serves as the fiduciary agent and hires staff and contractors to carry out projects as directed by the RCPT. The projects are all regional in nature and benefit all of the participating jurisdictions identified in the FEMA program guidance. Thus, the fact that New York is the SAA gives it no greater or lesser input in how the money is being spent. It is merely acting as the agent for disbursement.

The RCPT has approved nine (9) planning projects to date, all of which benefit the New Jersey/New York metropolitan region. The plans are on schedule, with some of them near completion. Thus, the RCPG has truly been utilized to fund regional preparedness and New Jersey and its citizens have and will continue to benefit from its projects.

12. During the FY 2010 budget process the Department of Law and Public Safety noted that the DNA processing caseload increased 300 percent between CY 2004 and CY 2009. Enactment of P.L.2003, c.183 expanded the list of crimes for which DNA is collected from convicted criminals, so an increase in processing caseload was not unexpected. The department further noted that there was a specific backlog of Forensic Biology cases from

DNA evidence collected at crime scenes. More recently, the Attorney General stated that there was a "significant" DNA lab caseload and that additional staffing was to be hired.

- **Question:** What is the caseload situation at the DNA lab at this time? Does the department view contracting out DNA processing as a viable means of managing its caseload? If not, why not? What are the legal ramifications, if any, of a processing backlog? What staffing changes need to be made, if any, to keep up with the DNA processing caseload? For calendar years 2009, 2010 and 2011 to date, please indicate the average number of days required to process a DNA sample.

The Office of Forensic Sciences ("OFS") currently has a total of 944 convicted offender samples to be analyzed; and, there is a backlog of 535 forensic biology cases, which are cases that involve the analysis of DNA evidence collected from crime scenes. There are no direct legal ramifications to having a processing backlog.

Contracting out DNA cases is not a viable option because private laboratories do not have access to the Combined DNA Index System ("CODIS"). According to the FBI, before a case can be entered into CODIS, the DNA profiles must first be returned to OFS for technical review. OFS can then enter the case into CODIS. In the past when OFS contracted out DNA samples, it found that the technical review of another laboratory's work took almost as much time as analyzing the case. That is the reason OFS discontinued contracting out samples to private laboratories and brought analysis in-house. In addition, it is much more expensive to contract out a case because testimony can cost up to \$2,000 per day with a two (2) day minimum when a private laboratory is called to testify. According to the U.S. Supreme Court Crawford decision, OFS can not testify for another laboratory in court. Also, private laboratories charge for pre-submission conferences and pre-trials. It generally takes private laboratories longer than the current OFS DNA turnaround time of 67 days.

For FY 2012, OFS has authorization and funding for 266 employees.

OFS is required to be accredited to remain in CODIS and to receive over \$1 million in federal grants. At the last accreditation surveillance visit, OFS was warned by ASCLD/LAB (our accreditation body) to either increase staff or discontinue testing in selected forensic disciplines.

The average number of days for turning around a forensic biology case over the last three years is as follows:

2011	67 days
2010	52 days
2009	45 days

Cases that have a juvenile defendant are always expedited. In addition, there are many instances when the forensic biology program is tasked with expediting an analysis. This could be for a number of reasons, but typically the agency is counting on a forensic DNA profile

being generated from the evidence that hits with a convicted offender in the database. This information may provide a valuable investigative lead in solving the crime. Many times the lab is also requested to expedite a case for a pending trial date. It is very common for the prosecutor's office to make last minute requests for additional testing prior to the start of a major trial.
